NEW JERSEY SCHOOLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 4, 2014

A meeting of the Board of Directors of the New Jersey Schools Development Authority ("SDA" or "the Authority) was held on Wednesday, June 4, 2014 at 9:00 AM at the offices of the Authority at 32 East Front Street, Trenton, New Jersey.

being a quorum of the Board. Ms. Lemelle, Mr. Lewis-Powder and Mr. Piaia participated in the meeting by telephone conference.

At the Chairman's request, Charles McKenna, chief executive officer (participating via teleconference); Jason Ballard, chief of staff; Andrew Yosha, executive vice president; Jane Kelly, vice president & assistant secretary; Donald Guarriello, vice president and chief financial officer; Raymond Arcario, vice president; Albert Barnes, chief counsel; Manuel DaSilva,

program director; Paul Hamilton, senior program officer; Gregory Voronov, managing director; Sean Murphy, director; Karon Simmonds, director; Susan Pacuta, director; Anthony Gilfillan, director, and Kristen Maclean, director, of the SDA participated in the meeting. Amy Herbold of the Governor's Authorities Unit also participated in the meeting.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. Walsh, who requested that Ms. Kelly read the requisite notice of the meeting. Ms. Kelly announced that the meeting notice had been sent to the *Trenton Times* and *Star-Ledger* at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, and had been duly posted on the Secretary of State's bulletin board at the State House in Trenton, New Jersey.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Mr. Walsh presented for consideration and approval the Minutes of the May 7, 2014 Open and Executive Session meetings. A copy of the minutes and a resolution had been provided to the Members for review in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Vargas, and seconded by Ms. Hassett, the Open and Executive Session minutes of the May 7, 2014 meeting were approved by the Board upon its unanimous vote in favor of the resolution attached hereto as *Exhibit 3a./3b*.

Authority Matters CEO Report

Mr. Walsh asked Ms. Kelly to provide the Members with the report of the CEO on behalf of Mr. McKenna. Ms. Kelly provided the Board with an update on project activity. She reported that the leases for temporary space for the Trenton Central High School project (TCHS) have been executed and that fit-out activities for the temporary spaces have been initiated within the Board approved dollar values. Ms. Kelly explained that those values will require an adjustment

in order to complete the entirety of the needed scope. She added that, in concluding negotiations with the landlords for the temporary space, the square footage of the spaces was finalized as were negotiations with the landlord's contractor. Ms. Kelly said that, as the result of both activities it was determined that there is a need for an adjustment to the overall cost of the temporary space. Ms. Kelly informed the Members that, with the inclusion of storage space costs as well as information technology fit-outs, the dollar value is about \$8 million which is approximately \$2 million higher than was projected earlier. She said that the adjustment was approved to advance by the Real Estate Committee at its May meeting and will be presented to the full Board today in Executive Session. In continuing, Ms. Kelly added that scoping activities are progressing for the demolition activities related to the existing school building. She said that programming interviews with TCHS staff and faculty have begun in relation to design development for the new school. Ms. Kelly noted that, as has been previously reported, the District has formed several committees, inclusive of district and community participation, relating to school programming and design, communication, etc. She said that the SDA is participating in the work of those committees, as appropriate, for coordination with design and procurement activities for the new project.

With regard to other SDA projects, Ms. Kelly reported that Mr. McKenna and other SDA staff visited the New Brunswick Redshaw project in May. She informed the Members that finish work is progressing and that the quality of the work is excellent. She said that the contractor (Hall Construction Co., Inc.) is making significant progress. She explained that project will be delivered earlier than September 2015, which is the date originally required in the contract. Ms. Kelly noted that the contractor believes that the building will be ready for September, 2014 occupancy but SDA Management believes that the date will be a bit later, perhaps mid-October.

She said that SDA Management has met with the contractor and the District to discuss its concerns and will continue to monitor the situation along with the District to coordinate when the building will be ready for occupancy. She said that the District has expressed the desire to occupy the building as soon as possible and will move in whenever the building is ready.

Ms. Kelly advised the Board that Mr. McKenna recently visited the Elizabeth Academic High School where work is progressing well and structural steel erection activities are ongoing. She said that Executive Staff also visited the Long Branch Catrambone project in mid-May, where work is on track for a September 2014 opening.

In continuing, Ms. Kelly reported that a limited notice to proceed (NTP) has been issued for the Bridgeton Buckshutem project for "footings and foundations" and for the Newark Oliver Street Project for "under slab activities". She said that, in each case, the contractor can begin construction work once Department of Community Affairs (DCA) and all other applicable permits are obtained.

With regard to procurement activities, Ms. Kelly advised the Board that the procurement for design-build services for the Gloucester City New Elementary/Middle School project was advertised on March 4. She said that three (3) responsive technical proposals were received on May 21 and interviews with the design-build teams are scheduled for June 9. She added that the bid opening is scheduled for June 12.

Next, Ms. Kelly reported that the procurement for design-build services for the Elizabeth New Elementary School project is scheduled to be advertised in early June. In addition, she reported that procurement for Internal Auditing Services for design-build projects was advertised on May 16 and that technical and price proposals are due on June 11.

Ms. Kelly then informed the Members that the procurement for the Site Consultant Services Task Order contract was advertised on May 28 and technical and price proposals are due on June 24.

She further advised the Board that the procurement for Independent Auditor Services is scheduled to be advertised in early June.

Ms. Kelly reminded the Members that Management is recommending an award to Turner Surety and Insurance Brokerage, Inc. for the Insurance Broker & Administration Services procurement and that this matter is on today's agenda. She noted that staff will be discussing it later in the meeting.

With regard to events and other SDA activities, Ms. Kelly reported that Mr. McKenna met with David Sciarra and Elizabeth Athos of the Education Law Center on May 12. She said that the meeting resulted in an interesting flow of ideas and the SDA is hopeful that the Authority and the ELC can find a way to move forward together.

Ms. Kelly reported that Program Directors Corrado Minervini and Thomas Schrum made a presentation before the Construction Managers Association of America to discuss the SDA, its construction managers and their relationship. She said that the presentation was productive and that the SDA is pleased that Mr. Minervini and Mr. Schrum participated in this forum on behalf of the SDA.

Ms. Kelly then reported that, on May 28, Mr. McKenna and SDA staff attended a groundbreaking ceremony for the Marshall Street School in Paterson alongside community advocates, Paterson Superintendent Donnie Evans, the entire legislative delegation, Mayor Jeffrey Jones and Paterson School Board members. She acknowledged Mr. Schrum and his team for their hard work in advancing this project.

In concluding, Ms. Kelly advised the Members that they soon will be receiving a copy of SDA's Biannual Report for the period October 1, 2013 to March 31, 2014. She acknowledged the efforts of the SDA Communications team, and in particular Edye Maier, in putting the report together. Ms. Kelly informed the Members that among the report's good news is that currently there are nine (9) schools in construction and that construction activities are expected to begin on nearly a dozen emergent projects over the summer months while the students are out of school. She said that even more projects are expected to proceed with construction activities, including school projects in Jersey City, Paterson, Bridgeton and Keansburg within the next few months. Mr. Walsh requested an update on the Oliver Street project's "footings and foundations" work. Mr. Yosha reported that soil conditions were revealed to be different from the results of the SDA's site investigation. He said that the situation was immediately remedied and the work progressed within the contract value. Mr. Yosha explained that an allowance had been established to address these types of occurrences.

Audit Committee Report

The Chairman then requested that Mr. Nixon provide the report of the Audit Committee. Mr. Nixon reported that the Audit Committee met on May 19, 2014. He said that Management had provided the Committee with the April 2014 New Funding Allocation and Capital Plan Update and reported a decrease of \$158,000 in the 2011 Capital Plan Emergent Projects Reserve. He noted that there were no changes in any of the remaining Reserve balances during the reporting period. He advised the Board that the reserve balance for the Regular Operating Districts (RODs) decreased by \$109.1 million during the reporting period to allow for the offer of 235 District grant projects approved by the DOE.

In continuing, Mr. Nixon notified the Board of a \$4,800 amendment to the SDA's Network Hardware and Software Support contract. He said that this will allow the provider to assume Domain Name System (DNS) hosting services in addition to other services they currently provide for the Authority. He noted that, while no official action is required by the Members, the SDA Operating Authority (OA) requires that the Board be notified of this amendment.

Next, Mr. Nixon reported that Management shared with the Committee the results of a recent statutorily required audit focusing on the processes and procedures followed on a qualified Section 15 Grants project. He advised that the audit determined that state funds were expended in accordance with the grant agreement, applicable laws and regulations. He said that no observations were noted.

In continuing, Mr. Nixon reported that the Committee was provided with the April 2014 Monthly Financial Report. He said that, year to date, the Authority's operating expenditures total \$7.1 million which is \$1.2 million lower than the operating budget for the corresponding period. He said that this is a \$200,000 decrease from actual expenses for the corresponding period in the prior year. He reported that, as of April 2014, year to date project expenditures are \$61.2 million, down \$35.5 million as compared to the Capital spending forecast for the corresponding period and \$7.6 million higher as compared to actual expenses in the corresponding prior year. He said that this is attributable to increased spending for construction related activity along with the 2013 insurance claim cost recovery for the Elliott Street School (\$8.4 million) offset by a decrease in grant activity of \$9.3 million. Mr. Nixon then noted that 68% of the funds authorized for the SDA Districts have been disbursed. He reported that 96% of all SDA disbursements relate to school facilities projects and 4% relate to program

administrative and general expenses. Mr. Nixon advised that the estimated value of current school facilities project activity is approximately \$2.2 billion.

Lastly, Mr. Nixon reported that Management had also discussed with the Committee, and the Committee recommends Board approval of, a contract award to Turner Surety and Insurance Brokerage, Inc. (TSIB) for Insurance Broker and Administration Services. He explained that Turner would serve as an insurance broker to support the construction of school facilities He gave a brief overview of the proposed Insurance Broker and projects statewide. Administration Services award as described in detail in the materials that had been previously provided for Committee review. Mr. Nixon requested that the Members approve the award of contract for Insurance Broker and Administration Services to TSIB for a total lump sum fee notto-exceed \$555,000 over the initial 3 year term of the agreement. He emphasized that if any of the contract covered services are not required by the Authority, the Authority will not incur charges related to any unused services. He further requested that the Members approve a cost not-to-exceed \$225,000 to address potential increases should the Authority's aggregate construction cost estimate (CCE) reach beyond \$400 million. Mr. Nixon advised the Board that, prior to execution, the contract and related documentation will be subject to review and approval by the SDA Division of Chief Counsel. The Members had questions regarding the price differentials in the lump sum figures set forth in the memorandum's Table #4. Mr. Walsh noted that a full discussion of this proposed contract was held in the Audit Committee and that he is comfortable with this award. Ms. Simmonds provided the Members with the pricing details of the highest ranked firms. She said that Management and SDA staff considered the fee proposal by TSIB to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided and inclusive of all elements contained in the Scope of Services.

A resolution for approval of the proposed award of contract for Insurance Broker and Administration Services to Turner Surety and Insurance Brokerage, Inc. had been provided to the Members in advance of the meeting. Upon a motion by Mr. Luckie and seconded by Mr. Vargas the proposed contract award was approved by the Board upon its unanimous vote in favor of the resolution attached hereto as *Exhibit 5a*.

School Review Committee Report

1) Molba Carpentry, Inc.; 2) Brockwell & Carrington Contractors Inc.; 3) Release of Funds from Program Reserve - Newark School District - Weequahic High School - Emergent Project - Exterior Masonry Repairs; 4) Release of Funds from Program Reserve - Newark School District - McKinley School - Emergent Project - Roof Replacement

The Chairman requested that Mr. Da Silva discuss the Passaic High School No. 12 (PHS 12) matter which appears on the agenda. Mr. Da Silva provided the Members with a brief overview of Change Order #1 in the amount of \$97,411 for Molba Carpentry, Inc. for the PHS 12 project in the Passaic Public School District. He referenced his memorandum that had been previously distributed to the Members and explained that the change order is needed due to scope changes. He said that the original scope, utilizing the General Contractor Task Order (GC Task Order), contemplated ground level drainage improvements and associated window repairs. He said that, after the investigation was performed, it became clear that a different scope was required. Mr. Da Silva said that the grade level drainage improvements aspect of the work remain the same. He described the scope changes as relating to the windows, lintel repairs and foundation water proofing at grade level He said that these combined to require an increase in the original budget of \$97,411.

A resolution pertaining to Change Order #1 for Molba Carpentry, Inc. had been provided to the Members in advance of the meeting. Following discussion, upon a motion by Mr.

McNamara, and seconded by Mr. Luckie, the resolution attached hereto as *Exhibit 6a1*. was unanimously approved by the Board.

Next, Mr. Da Silva reported that the Members are being asked to approve a credit change order to de-obligate unused funds pertaining to an emergent project for Washington Middle School in the Harrison Public Schools District. He explained that the emergent project involves structural repairs, through utilization of the GC Task Order for design. He noted that Brockwell & Carrington Contractors Inc. was the next firm on the GC Task Order list. Mr. Da Silva provided an overview of the project as outlined in his memorandum that had been previously distributed to the Members and discussed the basis for the overall change in price and credit due. Mr. Da Silva noted that the SDA credit is in the amount of \$222,885.27.

A resolution pertaining to the credit change order for Brockwell & Carrington Contractors Inc. had been provided to the Members in advance of the meeting. Upon a motion by Mr. Luckie, and seconded by Mr. Nixon, the resolution attached hereto as *Exhibit 6a2*. was unanimously approved by the Board.

Next, at Mr. Walsh's request, Mr. Voronov discussed Management's request for approval of a Release of Funds from the Program Reserve to address the emergent project for Weequahic High School in the Newark School District. He said that Management is seeking the release of \$1,094,816 for exterior masonry repairs. He provided an overview of the project as described in detail in his memorandum that was previously distributed to the Members.

A resolution pertaining to the Release of Funds from the Program Reserve for the Weequahic High School had been provided to the Members in advance of the meeting. Following discussion, upon a motion by Mr. Vargas and seconded by Mr. Luckie, the resolution attached hereto as *Exhibit 6b.* was unanimously approved by the Board.

Mr. Nixon then advised the Chairman that he is recused from participating in the discussion and vote on the next matter on the agenda involving the McKinley School in Newark. At Mr. Walsh's request, Mr. Voronov discussed Management's request that the Board approve the Release of Funds from the Program Reserve in the amount of \$1,510,211. He said that this request pertains to a roof replacement emergent project for the McKinley School. He provided an overview of the project as fully described in his memorandum that was previously distributed to the Members. Mr. Maloney inquired as to whether any of the schools that are receiving emergent work are scheduled to be replaced in the future. Mr. Voronov explained that the Newark district is currently under a reorganization plan and any work that the SDA performs will be in line with the reorganization plan. Mr. Yosha and Mr. Voronov clarified that staff routinely determines whether a school is due to be replaced when considering requests for emergent project funding.

A resolution pertaining to the Release of Funds from the Program Reserve for the McKinley School in the Newark School District had been provided to the Members in advance of the meeting. Following discussion, upon a motion by Mr. Vargas, seconded by Mr. Luckie, and with Mr. Nixon abstaining, the resolution attached hereto as *Exhibit 6c*. was approved by the Board.

Reports

The Chairman asked Mr. Ballard for an update regarding Project Closeouts. Mr. Ballard reported that, last month, SDA staff closed out eight (8) emergent projects, transferred two (2) emergent projects and closed out one Capital Plan project. He noted that the emergent projects were part of the list of the initial seventy-six (76) emergent projects that were pared down to sixty-eight (68). He thanked Mr. Da Silva and his team for their efforts.

Public Comments

The Chairman then opened the Public Comments portion of the meeting. He invited Ellen Simon, a member of the Jersey City School Board (School Board), to address the Members. Ms. Simon introduced herself and said that she was speaking on behalf of the School Board. She said that she is also a Jersey City parent. She advised the Board that she reviewed the SDA emergent project list and saw no projects listed in Jersey City. She said that Mr. McKenna subsequently gave her a list of six projects that had been approved in 2011. She reported that none of these projects have been started. Ms. Simon said that the District came to the SDA with a more extensive list of projects and is eagerly awaiting a status update on these projects. She said that, beyond the six 2011 approved projects which have not gone forward, no projects were approved in either 2012 or 2013. She noted that the District is still waiting to hear about its 2014 request.

Ms. Simon then referenced the two capital projects that the SDA is advancing in Jersey City and asked that the District be given a more granular report on the status of these projects than has been given in the past. Mr. Walsh responded that SDA staff will be in touch with Ms. Simon regarding the emergent projects. Ms. Maclean noted that the SDA website is being retooled to provide more detailed information on the capital project side and that this will be available for review shortly.

Ms. Kelly then advised the Members and the Public that the Board will be adjourning into Executive Session to discuss two matters—a funding authorization adjustment for the TCHS temporary facilities leases and a proposed settlement of prospective litigation relating to conditions at the Old Long Branch High School in the Long Branch School District.

Mr. Walsh then asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting and move into Executive Session. Upon motion and with unanimous consent, the meeting adjourned into Executive Session.

Following discussion in Executive Session, the Board returned to Open Session.

A resolution for approval of the proposed lease funding authorization adjustment for Trenton Central High School (TCHS) temporary facilities leases had been provided to the Members in advance of the meeting. Upon a motion by Mr. McNamara, and seconded by Mr. Vargas, the resolution attached hereto as *Exhibit A1*. was unanimously approved by the Board.

A resolution pertaining to the recommendation for settlement of prospective litigation relating to conditions at the Old Long Branch High School had been provided to the Members in advance of the meeting. Upon a motion by Mr. Nixon, and seconded by Mr. Vargas, the resolution attached hereto as *Exhibit A2*. was unanimously approved by the Board.

INTRODUCTION:

I am writing to recommend approval of the release of funds from the Program Reserve maintained for emergent projects and emergency situations to address an emergent condition at the James J. Ferris High School in Jersey City. This project is being advanced pursuant to NJSDA delegation for District management consistent with statutory and regulatory provisions. The release of funding requested is \$3,975,000.

Pursuant to the NJSDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010 as amended on March 7, 2012, Board approval is required for the release of funds from the Program Reserve for emergent projects or emergency situations exceeding \$500,000. The funding requested to address the emergent project at this school exceeds \$500,000.

BACKGROUND:

The James J. Ferris High School, built in 1969, is an approximately 246,000 square foot facility that educates 1,360 students in grades 9 to 12. As a result of joint NJSDA and NJDOE site visits conducted in the Jersey City School District to review potential emergent conditions within the district, the NJDOE issued Pre-Construction Approval on July 18, 2012 for an emergent project to address conditions related to the building's roofing system. Considerations supporting the decision to delegate included the District's successful prior management of similar emergent projects and recognition of the lack of complexity of this project.

After receipt of Pre-Construction Approval from the NJDOE, the NJSDA issued a grant offer to the District to allow for the advancement of the project. Upon receipt of necessary documentation from the District the grant agreement was executed on February 15, 2013. The District has engaged the Gibson Tarquini Group to review the emergent condition and develop a scope of work to address the roofing system. WHEREAS, the Operating Authority of the New Jersey Schools Development Authority requires that the Members of the Authority approve the release of funds from the Program Reserve for emergent projects or emergency situations exceeding \$500,000; and

WHEREAS, the Chancellor Avenue Annex School (the Chancellor School) is an approximately 54,000 square foot facility educating approximately 120 students in grades Kindergarten to 2; and

WHEREAS, following joint site visits conducted by SDA and State Department of Education (DOE) staff to review potential emergent conditions in the Newark School District, the DOE issued Pre-Construction Approval in July 2012 for an emergent project to address conditions related to the building's roofing system; and

WHEREAS, after receipt of Pre-Construction Approval, SDA issued a grant offer to the District to allow for the advancement of the Chancellor School project; and

WHEREAS, this project will advance pursuant to SDA delegation for district management consistent with statutory and regulatory provisions; and

WHEREAS, the project background, scope and budget is described in detail in the memorandum presented to the Board on this date and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the funding requested to address the emergent project at the Chancellor School is \$706,000, thus necessitating Board approval; and

WHEREAS, executive management and associated program staff recommend Board approval of the release of \$706,000 from the Program Reserve to address the emergent roof repairs/replacement project at the Chancellor School in the Newark School District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Members of the Authority hereby authorize and approve the release of \$706,000 from the Program Reserve to address the emergent roofing system project at the Chancellor Avenue Annex School in the Newark School District consistent with the memorandum presented to the Board on this date and incorporated herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately, but no action authorized herein shall have force and effect until 10 days, Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays excepted, after a copy of the minutes of the Authority meeting at which this resolution was adopted has been delivered to the Governor for his approval, unless during such 10 day period, the Governor shall approve same, in which case such action shall become effective upon such approval.

INTRODUCTION

We are writing to recommend approval by the Members of the Authority of the award of a contract in the amount of \$40,000,000 to Terminal Construction Corporation¹ for Design-Build services for the New Gloucester City ES/MS in the Gloucester City School District.

The Design-Build Team will complete the design for the facility utilizing SDA-developed schematic design documents and will also provide construction and construction administration services, including securing of all required permits and approvals, for a new school facility for grades 4 through 8. The form of contract for this engagement is a Design-Build contract with the general contractor as the lead and with relevant trades and design disciplines serving in sub-contractor and sub-consultant roles.

We are also recommending approval by the Members of the attached Final Project Charter representing the project budget inclusive of dollar values for the award of the design-build package.

Pursuant to the SDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended March 7, 2012, Board approval is required for the award of construction contracts greater than \$500,000 and for the approval of the Final Project Charter.

BACKGROUND

The New Gloucester City ES/MS will be a 122,000 square foot facility to educate 687 students in grades 4 through 8 in the Gloucester School District.

At the March 7, 2012 NJSDA Board Meeting, the New Gloucester City ES/MS project was approved to advance under the Authority's Capital Program. NJSDA staff had earlier undertaken a review and

validation of a schematic design for an earlier iteration of this project, finding inefficiencies and non-conformances to the NJSDA materials and systems standards. Further assessment revealed the suitability of the NJSDA developed "Kit of Parts" for this project.

A Construction Management firm (CM) will be engaged to manage the construction phase of the New Gloucester City ES/MS project. These services will be procured during the first quarter of 2015.

PROCUREMENT PROCESS

This package was advertised as a design-build solicitation on March 4, 2014 on the SDA website, NJ State website, and in selected newspapers for interested firms to participate in the bidding process. For this procurement, "Price" is weighted as more important than all "Other Factors," with price equaling 60% of the overall weight, and all non-price factors having a combined weight of 40%.

A mandatory pre-bid conference was held on March 14, 2014.

In accordance with regulations, the SDA employed a two-step process for this procurement. The first step required interested bidders to submit a Project Rating Proposal, which was used by the SDA to determine each bidder's Project Rating Limit, or maximum amount that a bidder may bid, for the project. Project Rating Proposals were received by March 24, 2014. Bidders were evaluated based on the largest of four projects completed in the past seven years, safety records as well as reference checks. Based on evaluation of the information submitted, eight (8) bidders received a Project Rating Limit.

The Project Rating Limits resulting from the Project Rating Evaluations are listed in Table 1 below:

The second step of the process required the bidders to simultaneously submit a Technical Proposal and a sealed Price Proposal. In advance of submission of Technical and Price Proposals, Bidders were permitted to submit questions seeking clarification of the procurement documents, until April 16, 2014. Addenda responses to Bidder Questions were issued to the bidders on April 11, May 2 and May 9, 2014.

Technical and Price Proposals were received on May 21, 2014 from four (4) bidders. The Technical Proposal provided information regarding the bidder's past experience and qualifications as well as the bidder's overall approach to the project and to the Design portion of the project. The Technical Proposal submitted by Thomas P. Carney, Inc. was rejected for being non-responsive to the RFP requirements. Interviews were held with each of the three (3) remaining Design-Build teams at SDA offices in Trenton on June 9, 2014 affording members of the Selection Committee an opportunity to obtain any additional information from each team as needed to complete their evaluations of the Technical Proposals.

Members of the Selection Committee, comprised of two (2) SDA Program Operations representatives and one (1) Gloucester City Public Schools representative, were responsible for independently evaluating and scoring the Technical Proposal submittals with respect to the non-price evaluation criteria. The proposals were evaluated by the Selection Committee members based on the following criteria:

- Design-Builder's experience on similar projects
- Experience of Design-Builder's Design Consultant on similar projects
- Design-Builder's prior affirmative action experience
- Approach to Project
- Approach to Schedule
- Approach to LEED requirements

Each Selection Committee member evaluated each Technical Proposal, assigning a raw score for each criterion on a scale of 0 to 10 as follows:

- 9 10 points outstanding response offers significant advantages.
- 7 8 points superior response exceeds requirements with no deficiencies.
- 5 6 points sufficient response meets the requirements with no significant deficiencies.
- 3 4 points minimal response meets the requirements but contains some significant deficiencies.
- 1 2 points marginal response comprehends requirements, but contains many significant deficiencies.
- 0 points unsatisfactory response requirements not addressed and lack of detail precludes adequate evaluation.

Weighting factors were then applied to each of the Selection Committee member's raw scores for each criterion to arrive at a total weighted score as follows in Table 2 below:

For each Technical Proposal, the individual criteria scores awarded by a particular Selection Committee member were added together to calculate a Total Non-Price score for that Technical Proposal. The maximum Total Non-Price Score is 100. All of the Total Non-Price Scores awarded to a Technical Proposal by the Selection Committee members were added together and averaged to arrive at a Final Non-Price Score for each Technical Proposal.

The results of the Selection Committee's review of the Technical Proposals are listed in Table 3 below:

Once all the Technical Proposals were scored, the Authority opened the sealed Price Proposals and reviewed them for responsiveness. The Price Proposals were publicly opened on June 12, 2014 and the bids were read aloud as required by law.

The lowest responsive Price Proposal was awarded the maximum number of points for the price component, which is 100. All other Price Proposals were awarded points based on the percentage that each proposal exceeded the lowest bid.

The results of the SDA's review of the Price Proposals are listed in Table 4 below:

Before being combined with the non-price scores, the price scores for all bidders were adjusted by a weighting factor of 60%, and the scores for the non-price "Other Factors" criteria were adjusted by a 40% weighting factor.

The combined scores and final rankings are listed in Table 5 below:

The highest ranked bidder was Terminal Construction Corporation (Terminal).

The bid submitted by Terminal was below the CCE. In order to understand the differential between the CCE and the bid price and to ensure the contractor's price proposal was inclusive of all scope elements, a conference was conducted on June 17, 2014 with Procurement, Program Operations, Contract Management Division and Terminal to review the bid. The discussion verified that Terminal had included all work per the scope of the project and identified variances between the NJSDA's CCE and Terminal's price proposal in several areas, with the majority of the overall variance representing costs related to Site Work, Interior Construction, Building Shell, HVAC and General Requirements. At the time of review, Terminal confirmed that its price proposal was inclusive of all scope elements contained in the Contract Documents.

The Program Operations Deputy Director, the Program Operations Director, the Contract Management Deputy Director and the Contract Management Director recommend award of the project to Terminal Construction Corporation. Ernest Bock & Sons has filed an objection to the award to Terminal Construction Corporation claiming that the scoring for technical proposals was arbitrary and capricious and that the project should be re-bid. The Authority will respond to this objection in due course.

FINAL PROJECT CHARTER

The attached Final Project Budget represents the project budget inclusive of actual dollar values for the award of the Design-Build contract, current estimates for all project scope elements inclusive of estimated costs for future scope elements such as FF&E, technology and appropriate contingencies. Additionally, the budget is inclusive of expenditures for a prior design engagement, as well as costs incurred related to land acquisition and related activities. The project budget of \$63.8 million in the Final Project Charter represents a decrease of approximately \$3.4 million from the Board approved Preliminary Project Charter which included significant redesign costs whereas the Final Project Charter represents project delivery efficiencies.

RECOMMENDATION

The Members of the Authority are requested to approve the award of a contract to the highest ranked bidder, Terminal Construction Corporation, for Contract No. ST-0014-B01 in the amount of \$40,000,000. Prior to execution of the contract, the contract and related documentation will be reviewed and approved by the SDA Division of Chief Counsel.

The Members of the Authority are also requested to approve the attached Final Project Charter representing all expended and projected funds necessary for completion of the project.

Vendor Services staff continues to participate at mandatory pre-bid and pre-construction meetings to instruct and inform bidders regarding SDA's SBE goals, policies and procedures, including:

- Small Business Enterprise subcontracting goal of 25% of all contracts
- County workforce goals for minorities and females
- Detailed process procedures to monitor and track the progress made toward these goals throughout the life cycle of each project

At these meetings, vendors are strongly encouraged to identify and hire minority-owned and women-owned firms, as well as locally-based enterprises, for diverse business participation on all school building projects. Additional outreach strategies are discussed and utilized.

SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (SBE) COMPLIANCE MONITORING

The SDA regularly exceeds the State-mandated 25% SBE goal. The total SDA contract dollars awarded from January 1 through April 30, 2014 was \$16,324,330. The figures below demonstrate compliance with this requirement.

SBE Breakdown

The total contract dollars awarded to all SBE contractors was \$10,524,187 (including minorities and women). This represents 64.47% of all SDA contracts.

Monthly Update:

- o No grants were offered during the reporting period.
- o 75 grants impacting 29 districts were executed during the reporting period representing \$40.9M in total project costs and state share of \$19.6M.
- o 10 grants impacting 7 districts were closed out during the reporting period representing \$24.1M in total project costs and state share of \$6.9M.
- o Since inception, over \$2.4B has been disbursed to over 510 regular operating districts through the grant program.
- o Since inception over \$3.3B in funding has been approved by the Department of Education and offered to regular operating districts through the grant program.

INTRODUCTION

With this memorandum, I am requesting authorization to proceed with an amendment to SDA's contract with Vinci Systems, LLC (Vinci), our current hardware and software maintenance provider. With the recommended amendment, in the amount of \$4,800, Vinci Systems would assume DNS (Domain Name System) hosting services in addition to the services they currently provide for the Authority.

On April 12, 2013, through a competitive bidding process, the Authority awarded a \$393,543 contract (3 year with an option to extend for 1 year) to Vinci for Network, Hardware & Software Maintenance Services. Adding responsibility for DNS hosting to the contract would cost an estimated \$2,400 annually, for a total cost of \$4,800 over the remaining term of the Vinci Systems contract.

The balance on the Vinci system agreement through the same period is \$265,343. The Information Systems Department has been under budget with the Vinvi agreement with a spend rate of \$128,000 vs. the \$131,181 approved.

REASON FOR CHANGE

SDA's DNS hosting service is currently provided on a complementary basis by SDA's internet service provider, Data Network Solutions (DNS). SDA has recently experienced DNS outages which negatively impacted our internet presence for both SDA staff working in the field and external parties accessing SDA systems. As a result, the Information Systems department is looking to change to a more secure and reliable DNS solution. We do not seek to terminate the contract with DNS. DNS will continue to provide internet offload, email screening and bagging services.

Vinci, who currently handles our computer hardware and network security, would buy space and services to host our DNS in the cloud and help manage the configuration with the assistance of SDA

Information Systems staff. This will enable SDA to manage and host our own DNS root service, enhancing network security and minimizing the risk of unanticipated network outages.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Information Systems advises against contracting for this service through the Garden State Network (GSN). Hosting DNS through GSN would require the acquisition of network equipment to tether into the GSN, with an anticipated cost \$8,000 to \$10,000 more than sourcing this service through Vinci Systems will require. Additionally, connecting to the GSN would place SDA at risk for losing autonomy and control over our computer infrastructure. It would be more advantageous for SDA to place the DNS in the cloud through the Vinci Systems contract and retain complete control over the SDA environment. Also, Information Systems is seeking to avoid network security breaches which could result from disclosing system specifications as would be required through a public bidding process.

The cost of these services will be absorbed through the approved 2014 Information Systems budget and included in the 2015 Information Systems budget.

The Chief Executive Officer is requested to approve this amendment in the amount of \$4,800. The SDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010 as amended March 7, 2012, provides for VP/CEO co-approval for an amendment which singularly does not exceed the lesser of \$100,000 or 10% of the contract value. Note that the Board of Directors must be notified of this amendment, though their approval is not required. We would request authorization to notify the Board of this amendment at the June 2014 Board meeting following presentation to the Audit Committee in May.

The Office of the Chief Financial Officer is providing the attached monthly financial report to the Members of the Authority for their information. Included on pages 1 and 2 of this report is a "Financial Summary" of the Authority's activities for the year. On pages 3 and 4 of the report is a summary of the Authority's operating expenditures, and headcount information. Page 3A contains an itemized breakdown of personnel costs that have been allocated to school facilities project costs from program general and administrative ("Operating") expense. The basic financial statement and cash flow report follow.

Year-to-Date Authority Operating Expenses (Actual vs. Budget)

For May 2014 year to date, Authority operating expenses, **\$8.6 million**, are **down \$1.3 million** as compared to the operating budget for the *corresponding period*. The deviation of actual expenses versus budget is due to:

- Lower salary & benefit costs **\$881K.** The Authority is currently 16 FTEs under budget. Also, the annual employer pension contribution payment was \$223K lower than anticipated;
- Year to date spending reductions related to; MIS system hardware & software purchases as well as external services, and project services \$114K; General Office & Facilities \$88K, and Contract Services \$85K.

Year-to-Date Authority Operating Expenses (Actual vs. Prior Year Actual)

For May 2014 year to date, Authority operating expenses, **\$8.6 million**, are **down \$32 thousand** as compared to the *corresponding prior year*. The decrease in the year-over-year expense is due to:

- Cost savings related to lower monthly rent expense associated with the lease termination of 1 West State Street office space \$286K;
- Lower annual employer pension contribution payment, \$204K;
- Lower MIS expenditures for system maintenance, hardware, and software \$45K;
- Offset by a higher allocation of payroll expense to project cost in 2013, (\$544K).

Year-to-Date School Facilities Project Expenditures (Actual vs. Forecast)

For May 2014 year to date, project expenditures, **\$83.5 million**, are **down \$40.3 million** as compared to the capital spending forecast for the *corresponding period*. The variance is primarily due to lower than anticipated expenditures in; grant activity **\$21.2M**, construction activity **\$17.7M**, and other project related activity **\$1.4M**.

Year-to-Date School Facilities Project Expenditures (Actual vs. Prior Year Actual)

For May 2014 year to date, project expenditures, **\$83.5 million**, have increased by **\$11.9M** as compared to the *corresponding prior year*. The year-over-year variance is attributable to increased spending for construction cost **\$15.5M**, and other project related activity **\$3.1M**, as well as the 2013 insurance claim cost recovery (credit in prior year) for the Elliott Street School **\$8.4M**, offset by a decrease in grant activity, **\$15.1M**.

Other

Since program inception, 68% of the funds authorized for the SDA Districts have been disbursed. Additionally, since program inception 96% of all SDA disbursements relate to school facilities projects and 4% relate to Operating expense.

The estimated value of active school facilities projects is approximately \$2.2B.
