APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

JULY 1, 2015 OPEN SESSION

NEW JERSEY SCHOOLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING WEDNESDAY, JULY 1, 2015

A meeting of the Board of Directors of the New Jersey Schools Development Authority ("SDA" or "the Authority") was held on Wednesday, July 1, 2015 at 9:00 A.M. at the offices of the Authority at 32 East Front Street, Trenton, New Jersey.

being a quorum of the Board. Mr. Walsh, Mr. Egan, Ms. Hassett, Ms. Lemelle, Mr. Piaia and Mr. Vargas participated in the meeting by teleconference.

At the Chairman's request, Charles McKenna, chief executive officer; Jason Ballard, chief of staff; Andrew Yosha, executive vice president; Jane F. Kelly, vice president and assistant secretary; Donald Guarriello, vice president and chief financial officer; Albert Barnes, chief counsel; Ritchard Sherman, managing director; Manuel Da Silva, director; and Sean Murphy, director of the SDA, participated in the meeting. Lisa LeBoeuf of the Governor's Authorities Unit also participated in the meeting.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. Walsh, who requested that Ms. Kelly read the requisite notice of the meeting. Ms. Kelly announced that the

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meeting notice had been sent to the *Trenton Times* and *Star-Ledger* at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, and had been duly posted on the Secretary of State's bulletin board at the State House in Trenton, New Jersey.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Mr. Walsh presented for consideration and approval the Minutes of the Board's June 3, 2015 Open Session meeting. A copy of the minutes and a resolution had been provided to the Members for review in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Ms. Lemelle and seconded by Mr. McNamara, the Open Session minutes of the June 3, 2015 meeting were approved by the Board upon its unanimous vote in favor of the resolution attached hereto as *Resolution 3a*.

Authority Matters CEO Report

Mr. Walsh asked Mr. McKenna to discuss recent SDA activities. Mr. McKenna provided the Members with an update regarding the Trenton Central HS (TCHS) project. He said that two sections of the facility have been abated and that required documentation will be submitted to the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) seeking issuance of demolition permits for those two sections. Mr. McKenna advised the Members that a permit has been issued for abatement and demolition of the roofs for all wings of the facility. He added that the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) conditionally approved the EO 215 on May 8. He noted that SDA is positioned to receive Department of Education (DOE) approval of its schematic design submission next month. Mr. McKenna reported that the Trenton Board of Education voted to move forward with one of the three conceptual design options.

Mr. McKenna then gave an update on projects in the Bridgeton School District. He said that ongoing activities for the Buckshutem ES project include installation of exterior brick and roof, ductwork and HVAC connections. Mr. McKenna said that work on the Quarter Mile Lane ES project is moving along.

In regard to projects in the Elizabeth School District, Mr. McKenna reported that the Elizabeth Academic HS project is moving along. He also reported that the design-builder's final design submission was received and is being reviewed in connection with the Elizabeth New ES project.

Next, Mr. McKenna gave an update on the Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 project. He said that the procurement package for construction management (CM) services was advertised on May 1 with SDA expecting to present an award recommendation at the August Board meeting. He said that SDA advertised in June for construction services for this project.

Mr. McKenna then informed the Members that DCA has issued construction permits for underground utilities, footings, foundations and structural steel, and has issued a limited Notice To Proceed (NTP) to the design builder for the Gloucester ES/MS project. He noted that the surcharge operation to address the geo-technically unsuitable soil is approximately 65% complete.

Next, Mr. McKenna said work is moving along on the Harrison New PK-1 ES project. In regard to the Irvington Madison Avenue ES project, Mr. McKenna said that site investigation activities are ongoing. He added that advertising for procurement of early site construction services/demolition is expected by the end of July.

Mr. McKenna then gave an update on projects in the Jersey City School District. He said that the Jersey City PS 20 project is approximately 74% complete and interior work is ongoing. He advised that work continues on the building footings, foundations, and underground plumbing for the Jersey City ES No. 3 project.

Next, Mr. McKenna reported that work on the Keansburg Caruso ES project is moving along.

Mr. McKenna provided an update on the activities underway at the existing Millville HS. He said that an information memo is being presented to the Board today regarding advancement of bridging design activity.

Turning to projects in the Newark School District, Mr. McKenna said that work on the Elliott Street ES and Oliver Street ES projects is moving along. Mr. McKenna informed the Members that SDA advertised in June for design build services for the South Street ES project.

In continuing, Mr. McKenna gave an update on projects in the Orange School District. He reported that work on the Orange HS project is moving along. In regard to the Cleveland ES project, Mr. McKenna informed the Members that twelve design consultant proposals were received in June and are currently under review. He added that interviews with the short-listed firms are scheduled for July 9.

Next, Mr. McKenna gave an update on projects in the Passaic School District. He said that work is moving along on the Henry Street ES project and that this school will be opening in September 2015. In regard to the Leonard Place ES project, Mr. McKenna reported that the schematic design submission for the project has been completed. He advised the Board that district approval is anticipated within the next month.

Turning to projects in the Paterson School District, Mr. McKenna reported that progress is being made on the Marshall Street ES project. Next, Mr. McKenna said that slab on grade concrete work is being finalized as all underground utilities are being completed for the Paterson PS 16 project. He noted that masonry work continues on both exterior and interior walls. He added that a beam signing ceremony will be held later in the day at the project site.

Mr. McKenna then informed the Members that the district has approved the schematic design submission and SDA is positioned to receive DOE approval within the next month for the Perth Amboy Seaman Avenue ES project.

Next, Mr. McKenna said that work is moving along on both the Phillipsburg HS and Vineland MS projects.

Mr. McKenna then provided an update regarding SDA's current procurement activity. He said that, today, management will be recommending an award to Epic Management, Inc. for construction management services for the Elizabeth New ES project. He said that new activity includes procurements for construction services for the Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 project and design-build services for the Newark South Street ES project. Mr. McKenna said that, as he has previously reported, other procurement activity underway includes procurements for: the Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 project; the New Brunswick Paul Robeson ES project; the Orange Cleveland ES project; the Camden HS project; and a term contract for furniture, fixtures and equipment.

Mr. McKenna then discussed the Authority's upcoming events, outreach and other activity. He said that the SDA's Biannual Report, which was shared with the Board early last month, was delivered to the Legislature on June 10, 2015.

Mr. McKenna also advised the Members that SDA will be holding a beam signing/topping off ceremony for the Paterson PS 16 project at 2:00 PM following today's Board meeting.

In response to an inquiry by Mr. Walsh, Mr. McKenna confirmed that the Passaic Henry Street ES will open in September 2015.

Audit Committee

The Chairman then requested that Mr. Nixon provide the report of the Audit Committee. Mr. Nixon reported that the Audit Committee met on June 15, 2015. He said that management had provided the Committee with the May 2015 New Funding Allocation and Capital Plan Update. He said that management reported that there was no change in the Unforeseen Events Reserve balance and that there was an \$8.8 million decrease in the Planning Reserve balance for the reporting period due to the need for additional funding for the Harry L. Bain ES project in West New York. He explained that the Board-approved funding was needed for the more fully detailed scope of renovations necessary for the school facility. He advised that there was a decrease of \$3.3 million in the 2008 Capital Plan Emergent Projects Reserve balance due to an increase in commitments associated with the Board-approved project charter and funding release for the Irvington HS roof and HVAC emergent project. He then advised that there was a decrease of \$16.5 million in the 2011 Capital Plan Emergent Projects Reserve balance due to an increase in commitments associated with three Board-approved project charter and funding release for the Irvington HS roof and HVAC emergent project. He then advised that there was a decrease of \$16.5 million in the 2011 Capital Plan Emergent Projects Reserve balance due to an increase in commitments associated with three Board-approved emergent projects. He identified these as the Bridgeton Broad Street ES masonry repairs project; Plainfield HS window replacement project and Vineland HS South HVAC system repair and replacement project.

He added that the reserve balance for the Regular Operating Districts ("RODs") increased by \$1.6 million during the reporting period due to a reduction in state share for grant projects nearing completion.

Mr. Nixon then reported that SDA's auditing group and outside auditor, Experis, presented the Committee with the results of two real-time construction audits. He reported that there were two recommendations/observations presented in connection with one audit. He noted that the audits were conducted in compliance with the statutory requirement that capital portfolio projects over \$10 million be reviewed to assess whether State funds were expended in

accordance with contract terms, SDA practices and state rules and regulations. He advised that both audits revealed that State funds utilized for the projects were expended prudently and consistent with legal requirements.

Next, Mr. Nixon reported that the Committee was provided with the May 2015 Monthly Financial Report. He said that, year-to-date, the Authority's operating expenditures total \$8.5 million which is \$1.5 million lower than the operating budget for the corresponding period. He said that this is \$72,000 lower than actual expenses for the corresponding period in the prior year. He reported that, as of May 2015, year-to-date project expenditures are \$173.7 million, down \$31.2 million as compared to the 2015 Capital spending forecast for the corresponding period and \$90.3 million higher as compared to actual expenses in the corresponding prior year. He said that this is largely attributable to a \$27.8 million increase in spending for construction activity, \$25.2 million for grant activity, and \$5.5 in project insurance (including the \$4.9 million' down payment for the 3 year OCIP renewal) along with \$28.3 million in property acquisition costs and \$3.5 million related to other project costs.

In concluding, Mr. Nixon noted that, since program inception, 71.7% of the funds authorized for the SDA districts have been disbursed. He reported that 96% of all SDA disbursements relate to school facilities projects and 4% relate to program administrative and general expenses. Mr. Nixon advised the Board that the estimated value of current school facilities project activity is approximately \$2.2 billion.

School Review Committee

Credit Change Orders: Catcord Construction Company, Inc.; Tricon Enterprises, Inc.; Construction Manager Award – Elizabeth Public Schools District- New Elizabeth ES; Notification of Authorization to Proceed with the Next Design Phase for the Millville HS Addition/Renovation Project (Informational)

Mr. Luckie's absence. Mr. McNamara informed the Members that the Committee met on June 15, 2015. He then discussed management's request that the Board approve credit change order No. 1 for Catcord Construction Company, Inc. (Catcord) in connection with the Irvington Union Avenue MS project. Mr. McNamara reported that the Union Avenue MS is a 137,467 square foot facility educating 672 students in grades 6 through 8. He said that DOE had identified an emergent condition at the facility related to water infiltration and the SDA addressed that emergent condition. He said that Catcord was issued the NTP to perform the work on June 11, 2013 on a time and material basis with a not-to-exceed (NTE) value of almost \$2.4 million. Mr. McNamara said that the NTE value of the award was based upon the scope of work for the most extensive solution to address the emergent condition including replacement of identified roof sections, masonry repairs, and replacement of 150 window lintels. He explained that the final recommended corrective action for the emergent condition represents a significant reduction in scope from what was represented by the NTE value of the award. He informed the Members that SDA authorized Catcord to proceed with construction activities on March 24, 2014 and construction activities were completed on May 20, 2015. Mr. McNamara said that SDA staff has reviewed the documentation and validated the costs for each invoice submitted by Catcord and found them to be in order. He added that credit change order No. 1, in the amount of \$721,234.37, representing the dollar value of work that was not required to be performed by Catcord, is greater than \$500,000 and 10% of the contract value with the result that management is bringing it to the Board with a recommendation for approval.

A resolution pertaining to this matter had been provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Nixon and seconded by Mr. Maloney, credit change order No. 1 in the amount of \$721,234.37 to Catcord Construction Corporation, Inc. for the

Mr. McNamara then discussed management's request that the Board approve credit change order No. 2 for Tricon Enterprises, Inc. (Tricon) in connection with the Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 project. He said that the New Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 will provide a new 50,328 square foot facility designed to educate 275 students in grades K to 5. He reported that, on June 2, 2014, Tricon was issued a NTP, for demolition and early site plan activities to 1) demolish the existing structure and proceed with the removal and disposal of all subsurface footings, foundations, slabs, and unsuitable soil; and 2) prepare the site for the construction of the project. He added that volumes and weights for the early site preparation package defined by SDA were based upon the prior use of the project site and the anticipation of undocumented unforeseen conditions. Mr. McNamara noted that, throughout advancement of the early site plan work, the defined volumes and weights were less than previously anticipated resulting in the need for this credit change order. He advised the Members that this credit change order, in the amount of \$139,476.40, representing the dollar value of work not required to be performed by Tricon, is the aggregate dollar value of scope that was determined to be unnecessary during the course of performance of the work. He added that Tricon concluded its work on April 1, 2015 and the execution of this change order is necessary to close out the contract.

A resolution pertaining to this matter had been provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Nixon and seconded by Mr. Maloney, credit change order No. 2 in the amount of \$139,476.40 to Tricon Enterprises, Inc. for the Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 project was approved with the Board's unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 6a2*.

As Mr. McNamara is recused from this matter, Mr. Murphy discussed management's request that the Board approve the contract award for the New Elizabeth ES project. Mr. Murphy said that, in November 2014, the Members of the Authority approved the final project charter and award for design-build services to Torcon, Inc. for this project and an NTP to Torcon was issued in December 2014. He explained that before the Board today is the award of a contract for construction management services for that project. He said that this package was advertised as a "price (40%) and other factors (60%)" solicitation. He said that SDA received six responsive proposals. Referencing his memorandum that had been previously provided to the Board, Mr. Murphy then discussed the details of the procurement process that was followed by management. He noted that Epic Management, Inc. (Epic) was the lowest responsive bidder and also the number one ranked technical firm. He said that, upon completion of the procurement process and with Epic having confirmed that its proposal is inclusive of all scope elements, SDA management recommends award of the contract in the amount of \$1,160,134 to Epic for construction management services for the New Elementary School.

A resolution pertaining to this matter had been provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made Mr. Piaia, seconded by Mr. Egan, and with Mr. McNamara recused and abstaining, the contract award for construction management services to Epic Management, Inc. for the New Elizabeth ES project in the Elizabeth Public Schools District was approved with the Board's vote in favor of *Resolution 6b*.

At the Chairman's request, Mr. Sherman then provided some background information regarding the Millville HS addition/renovation project. He notified the Members of management's issuance to RSC Architects of an authorization to proceed with the remaining bridging design consultant services for the project. Mr. McKenna explained that, while management is authorized to proceed in this manner, given that the cost, at \$1.7 million, is

substantial, it is appropriate to notify the Board regarding the issuance of the contract. Mr. Yosha provided additional project details.

Public Comments

The Chairman then opened the Public Comments portion of the meeting. Ms. Kelly asked Mr. Frank Faras, a Trenton resident and taxpayer, to address the Board.

Mr. Faras advised the Board that he lives across the street from TCHS. He expressed concern with the SDA's process and proposal for the new TCHS. He stressed that the design of the building proposed to replace the existing school is architecturally inappropriate. He stated that the SDA has not presented the feasibility study that is required by law to determine the actual cost of rehabilitating the existing school. He cited deficiencies with the feasibility study that was presented by the SDA. He suggested that rehabilitation of the existing TCHS may cost less than the building of a new school. He then read an excerpt from the publication "Smart Growth Principles" in furtherance of his point. In conclusion, Mr. Faras asked the Board to reconsider demolishing TCHS.

Next, Darlene Womack, a Trenton resident, addressed the Board. Ms. Womack said that her home backs up to the TCHS site. She advised that her children play outside and noted that her primary concern with the upcoming demolition is with environmental impacts. She specifically asked about the air quality impacts. Mr. McKenna described the air quality controls that are in place at TCHS and advised that there have been no issues to date. He assured Ms. Womack that the community will be informed if an issue with air quality should arise. Mr. Da Silva advised that monitoring is ongoing during the abatement process. Ms. Womack then asked about rodent abatement. Mr. Da Silva explained that there is a pest control provision in the abatement-demolition contract to address the rodent population. Ms. Womack then asked if preliminary assessment reports have been completed. Mr. McKenna advised that under EO215 there is no requirement that SDA prepare an EO215, however, SDA has done so. He then explained that the DEP and Department of Labor (DOL) are also monitoring activities at the site. At Mr. McKenna's request, Ms. Womack was provided with the SDA hot-line telephone number for future inquiries. Mr. McKenna stressed that the SDA is trying to minimize, as much as possible, any inconvenience to those residing in the neighborhood adjacent to the site during construction of the TCHS project.

Ms. Kelly asked Mr. Billie Hayes to address the Board. Mr. Hayes discussed his concerns with certain aspects of the work on the TCHS project. He expressed the desire to speak with the DEP and SDA's environmental consultant to confirm that the work is proceeding in an environmentally acceptable manner. He also expressed his dissatisfaction with the design for the new school facility that has been selected by the Trenton Board of Education. He explained that the neighborhood surrounding the school site is historic and that the selected design does not blend into the neighborhood.

In continuing, Mr. Hayes suggested that the district should be provided with its own project manager for the TCHS project, to be funded by the SDA. He also encouraged the Members to read the environmental reports prepared with respect to the project. Mr. McKenna and Mr. DaSilva responded to the various issues raised by Mr. Hayes.

Mr. Walsh then asked for a motion to adjourn the Open Session meeting into Executive Session. Ms. Kelly announced that the Members would be discussing a matter in Executive Session regarding a request for approval of a real estate acquisition in connection with the Cleveland Street ES project in City of Orange Township School District. Thereafter, upon motion and with unanimous consent, the meeting adjourned into Executive Session.

Following discussion in Executive Session, the Board returned to Open Session.

INTRODUCTION

We are writing to recommend approval by the Members of the Authority of the award of a design contract for pre-design phase services at Camden High School in the Camden City School District. Upon completion of the pre-design phase services, at the NJSDA's option, we may elect to engage the design consultant for Design and Construction Phase services. Pursuant to the NJSDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended on March 7, 2012, Board approval is required for the award of a design agreement with both predevelopment and design services.

A project Charter will be presented to the members for consideration at a future date, after the performance of pre-design phase services and greater definition of project scope.

At the March 7, 2012 NJSDA Board Meeting, the Members approved the Authority's 2012 Capital Plan. That Plan identified a project to address facility conditions deficiencies at the Camden City School District's Camden High School. Working with representatives of the Camden City School District and the New Jersey Department of Education (DOE), NJSDA staff has reviewed and validated District needs and has preliminarily identified the recommended project scope to address those needs.

BACKGROUND

Camden High School (CHS) is an approximately 300,000 square foot facility currently educating approximately 720 students in Grades 9 to 12. Following approval of the NJSDA's 2012 Capital Plan, a Working Group comprised of District, DOE and NJSDA staff was convened to review and validate the conditions deficiencies and to identify project scope items necessary to be addressed at CHS. This

validation process included a review of existing facility conditions needs as well as discussion of District-wide high school enrollments and high school program needs.

Based upon this validation of needs, the Working Group recognized that an evaluation and development of options would require a more detailed assessment of the condition of the existing facility, additional program development and additional preliminary predevelopment activities. It was the Working Group's final recommendations to engage a Design Consultant to conclusively evaluate the existing conditions and identify appropriate potential options to address programmatic needs at the CHS facility. This evaluation will include development of project scope options, assessment of project delivery options, cost estimates, environmental considerations and schedule impacts for the project

PROJECT SCOPE

The project scope is anticipated to include renovations, systems upgrades, and repairs as necessary to accommodate existing and planned educational programs and to address facility conditions deficiencies. This is a 300,000 square foot facility that will serve to educate approximately 1,200 students in grades 9-12 in four Small Learning Communities (SLCs) of approximately 300 students each. The SLCs will be organized to be as autonomous as possible while recognizing the need for some shared spaces in order to effectively and efficiently utilize the existing facility.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The design engagement for this project shall be done in two phases; Pre-Design Phase Services and, Design and Construction Administration Phase Services. The purpose of the Pre-Design phase is to develop and evaluate appropriate project scopes and identify alternative solutions to address the identified conditions.

A Construction Management firm (CM) will be hired to manage the construction phase of the renovation of the CHS.

PROCUREMENT PROCESS

In accordance with NJSDA regulations, the NJSDA employed a two-step process for this procurement. The first step was to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) and then review all responses in order to shortlist the top six (6) ranked firms. The second step was to interview the shortlisted firms.

The RFP was advertised beginning on May 4, 2015 on the NJSDA website and the New Jersey State website. In addition, the advertisement was distributed to those firms that are pre-qualified in the area of Architecture (P001) with an Unlimited Rating by both the Department of Treasury-Division of Property Management and Construction and the NJSDA.

A Selection Committee consisting of three NJSDA staff members and one alternate was established.

A mandatory pre-bid conference held on May 14, 2015 was attended by fifteen (15) prequalified architectural firms. Responsive proposals were received from nine (9) firms by June 11, 2015.

Technical Proposals were evaluated by the Selection Committee. Evaluations were based upon the information provided by the firms in response to the RFP for this project. The Selection Committee members independently evaluated the Technical Proposals for Design Consultant Services based on the following criteria:

- Team Design Consultant Experience
- Key Team Member Qualifications
- Team Approach to Predesign Phase Services
- Team Approach to Design Phase Services
- Team Approach to Construction Phase Services
- Team Approach to Minimizing Potential for Change Orders
- Team Approach to Achieving LEED Certification

Each Selection Committee member evaluated each Technical Proposal, assigning a raw score for each criterion on a scale of 0 to 10 as follows:

- Outstanding (9–10): depth and quality of response offers significant advantages.
- Superior (7-8): exceeds RFP requirements with no deficiencies.
- Sufficient (5-6): meets RFP requirements with no significant deficiencies.
- Minimal (3-4): meets RFP requirements but contains some significant deficiencies.
- Marginal (1-2): comprehends intent of RFP but contains many significant deficiencies.
- Unsatisfactory (0): requirements not addressed and lack of detail precludes adequate evaluation.

Weighting factors were applied to each of the Selection Committee member's raw scores for each criterion to arrive at a total weighted score as follows:

The RFP stipulated that a shortlist of the six (6) highest-ranked firms would be determined based on the Final Technical Proposal Scores. The shortlisted firms participated in interviews with the Selection Committee on June 25, 2015. The interviews allowed the firms to expand and detail their firm and team experience with respect to NJSDA requirements for Design Consultant Services. The Selection Committee interviewed each of the shortlisted firms and evaluated each firm on Interview Criteria and Weighting Factors that were the same as those used in the evaluation of the Technical Proposals, as detailed above.

The individual criteria scores awarded by a particular Selection Committee member were added together to calculate an Interview Score for that firm. The maximum Interview Score is 100. All of the Interview Scores awarded to a particular firm by the Selection Committee members were added together and averaged to arrive at a Final Interview Score for each firm. The firm receiving the highest Final Combined Score (DIGroup) proposed a lump sum fee of \$1,295,525, inclusive of \$900,000 in allowances, for the required Design Consultant Predesign Phase Services. NJSDA staff, in accordance with NJSDA regulations, reviewed the fees proposed by DIGroup, and conducted a detailed fee review with DIGroup. The deliverables were reviewed and the anticipated level of effort for each task was discussed comparing the effort DIGroup proposed to the effort NJSDA estimated each task would require. This discussion revealed a clearer understanding of the work effort required and it was established that certain economies that had not been anticipated earlier by DIGroup were available. Accordingly, DIGroup revised its fee in response to NJSDA comments resulting in a reduction of \$105,655 to arrive at a revised total lump sum fee of \$1,189,870 for Design Consultant Predesign Phase Services for the Camden High School project. The negotiated fees are listed in Table 5 below:

INTRODUCTION

I am writing to recommend approval by the Members of the Authority of the award of a contract for Construction Management (CM) Services. This contract is for services to manage the construction of James Madison Elementary School No. 10 in the Garfield School District.

Pursuant to the NJSDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended March 7, 2012, Board approval is required for the award of consultant contracts greater than \$100,000. Funding for this engagement is available within the Project Budget, in accordance with the most recent Project Charter approved by the Members on August, 7, 2013.

BACKGROUND

The New James Madison Elementary School No. 10 will be a 52,961 square foot facility to educate 275 students in grades Kindergarten through Five in the Garfield School District.

Demolition and Early Site Preparation work was completed on March 27, 2015.

The procurement for construction services was advertised on June 30, 2015. We expect that action regarding the construction services procurement will be brought for Board consideration in October 2015. We are now seeking Board approval regarding a contract for CM Services.

PROCUREMENT PROCESS

This package for CM Services was advertised as a "Price and Other Factors" solicitation beginning on May 1, 2015 on the NJSDA website and on the State of New Jersey Business Opportunities website. In addition, the advertisement was distributed to those firms that are pre-qualified in the area of Construction Management (P029) by both the Department of Treasury-Division of Property Management and Construction and the NJSDA. For this procurement, price was weighted as 40% of the overall weight, and all non-price factors had a combined weight of 60%.

A Selection Committee consisting of three NJSDA staff members and one alternate was established.

Qualifications and Technical Proposals were evaluated by the Selection Committee. Evaluations were based upon the information provided by the firms in response to the RFQ/RFP for this project. The committee members evaluated the Qualifications and Technical Proposals for Construction Management Services separately based on the following criteria:

- Firm's CM Experience on Similarly Sophisticated Projects
- Staffing Proposal

Each Selection Committee member evaluated each Qualifications and Technical Proposal, assigning a raw score for each criterion on a scale of 0 to 10 as follows:

- Sufficient (5-6): meets RFQ/RFP requirements with no significant deficiencies.

The bid submitted by McCloud was less than the NJSDA estimate. In order to ensure the firm's Price Proposal is inclusive of all scope elements, a conference was conducted on July 17, 2015 with Procurement, Program Operations, Contract Management Division and McCloud to review the bid. WHEREAS, upon review, The McCloud Group, LLC confirmed that its Price Proposal is inclusive of all scope elements contained in the contract documents; and

WHEREAS, prior to execution, the contract and related documentation will be reviewed and approved by the SDA Division of Chief Counsel.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Members of the Authority hereby authorize and approve the award of a contract in the amount of \$956,975.90 to The McCloud Group, LLC, for construction management services for the New James Madison Elementary School No. 10 in the Garfield School District.

INTRODUCTION

We are writing to recommend approval of two actions by the Members of the Authority: the award of a design contract for pre-design phase services and approval of a Planning Charter (copy attached) to support an identified scope of work for the Cleveland Street Elementary School in the Orange Public Schools District ('District''). Upon completion of the pre-design phase services, at the NJSDA's option, we may elect to engage the design consultant for Design and Construction Phase services.

Pursuant to the NJSDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended on March 7, 2012, Board approval is required for the award of a design agreement with both predevelopment and design services. Board Approval is also required for a project Planning Charter.

At the March 7, 2012 NJSDA Board Meeting, the Members approved the Authority's 2012 Capital Plan. That Plan identified a project to address facility conditions deficiencies at the District's Cleveland Street Elementary School. Working with representatives of the District and the New Jersey Department of Education (DOE), NJSDA staff has reviewed and validated District needs and has preliminarily identified the recommended project scope to address those needs.

BACKGROUND

Cleveland Street Elementary School is a 41,400 square foot facility educating 306 students in Kindergarten through Grade 7. Prior to inclusion of the project in the 2012 Capital Plan, a Working Group comprised of District, DOE and NJSDA staff was convened to review and validate the conditions deficiencies and to identify project scope items necessary to be addressed at the Cleveland Street ES.

Upon identification of those deficiencies, the Working Group proceeded to review and collaborate on the conditions for inclusion in the project scope. Concurrent with the facility deficiencies review, DOE performed an assessment of district enrollments and capacity, utilizing information that had been updated after the inclusion of the project in the Capital Plan; specifically, DOE utilized the May 2013 Educational Facilities Needs Assessment. Based upon that assessment, DOE concluded that existing District facilities lack the capacity of approximately 485 students in grades Pre K to 12. As a result, additional NJSDA site visits to all District schools were conducted which served to validate the existence of District-wide overcrowding. Therefore, it was determined that advancement of projects that would only specifically address facilities conditions deficiencies would not address District-wide overcrowding needs.

Based on this review and validation, the Working Group proceeded to preliminarily identify potential solutions to address both the facilities conditions needs of two facilities and alleviate the District-wide overcrowding. Working group discussions served to reveal that the most efficient means of addressing District-wide overcrowding would be through the completion of additions and renovations at both the Cleveland Street ES and Orange HS. These expansions will allow for the Orange Preparatory Academy and Orange HS facilities, which share a site, to be combined into a campus serving students in grades 7 to 12 and allow the District's elementary schools to serve students in grades Pre-K to 6. These combined actions will serve to address overcrowding at all grade levels District-wide.

Site acquisition activities will be necessary to support the addition to the Cleveland Street E.S. The Planning Charter includes such activities along with related environmental investigation and review activities.

PROJECT SCOPE

The project scope is anticipated to include construction of an 11,500 square foot addition as well as renovations to the existing Cleveland Street E.S. inclusive of system upgrades and repairs as necessary to accommodate existing and planned educational programs and to address facility conditions deficiencies.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The design engagement for this project shall be done in two phases; Pre-Design Phase Services and Design and Construction Administration Phase Services. The purpose of the Pre-Design phase is to

develop an appropriate project scope and identify alternative solutions to address the identified conditions.

A Construction Management firm (CM) will be hired to manage the construction phase of the addition and renovation of the Cleveland Street ES.

PROCUREMENT PROCESS

In accordance with NJSDA regulations, the NJSDA employed a two-step process for this procurement. The first step was to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) and then review all responses in order to shortlist the top six (6) ranked firms. The second step was to interview the shortlisted firms.

The RFP was advertised beginning on May 11, 2015 on the NJSDA website and the New Jersey State website. In addition, the advertisement was distributed to those firms that are pre-qualified in the area of Architecture (P001) with ratings of \$20 Million and greater by both the Department of the Treasury-Division of Property Management and Construction and the NJSDA.

A Selection Committee consisting of three NJSDA staff members and one alternate was established.

A mandatory pre-bid conference held on May 20, 2015 was attended by seventeen (17) pre-qualified architectural firms. Responsive proposals were received from twelve (12) firms by June 18, 2015. Technical Proposals were evaluated by the Selection Committee. Evaluations were based upon the information provided by the firms in response to the RFP for this project. The Selection Committee members independently evaluated the Technical Proposals for Design Consultant Services based on the following criteria:

- Team Design Consultant Experience
- Key Team Member Qualifications
- Team Approach to Predesign Phase Services
- Team Approach to Design Phase Services
- Team Approach to Construction Phase Services
- Team Approach to Minimizing Potential for Change Orders
- Team Approach to Achieving LEED Certification

Each Selection Committee member evaluated each Technical Proposal, assigning a raw score for each criterion on a scale of 0 to 10 as follows:

- Outstanding (9–10): depth and quality of response offers significant advantages.
- Superior (7-8): exceeds RFP requirements with no deficiencies.
- Sufficient (5-6): meets RFP requirements with no significant deficiencies.
- Minimal (3-4): meets RFP requirements but contains some significant deficiencies.
- Marginal (1-2): comprehends intent of RFP but contains many significant deficiencies.
- Unsatisfactory (0): requirements not addressed and lack of detail precludes adequate evaluation.

Weighting factors were applied to each of the Selection Committee member's raw scores for each criterion to arrive at a total weighted score as follows:

For each firm's Technical Proposal, the individual criteria scores awarded by a particular Selection Committee member were added together to calculate a Technical Proposal Score for that firm. The maximum Technical Proposal Score is 100. All of the scores awarded by the Selection Committee members to a particular firm's Technical Proposal were added together and averaged to arrive at a Final Technical Proposal Score for each firm. The responsive firms, their scores and rankings are listed in Table 1 below:

The RFP stipulated that a shortlist of the six (6) highest-ranked firms would be determined based on the Final Technical Proposal Scores. The shortlisted firms participated in interviews with the Selection Committee on July 9, 2015. The interviews allowed the firms to expand and detail their firm and team experience with respect to NJSDA requirements for Design Consultant Services. The Selection Committee interviewed each of the shortlisted firms and evaluated each firm on Interview Criteria and Weighting Factors that were the same as those used in the evaluation of the Technical Proposals, as detailed above.

The individual criteria scores awarded by a particular Selection Committee member were added together to calculate an Interview Score for that firm. The maximum Interview Score is 100. All of the Interview Scores awarded to a particular firm by the Selection Committee members were added together and averaged to arrive at a Final Interview Score for each firm. The shortlisted firms, their scores and rankings are listed in Table 2 below:

Once all the Final Combined Scores for all shortlisted firms were calculated, the NJSDA opened the sealed Fee Proposals for Predesign Phase Services and reviewed them for responsiveness. The results of the NJSDA's review of the Fee Proposals are listed in Table 4 below:

The firm receiving the highest Final Combined Score (Lan Associates) proposed a lump sum fee of \$397,609, inclusive of \$200,000 in allowances, for the required Design Consultant Predesign Phase Services. NJSDA staff, in accordance with NJSDA regulations, reviewed the fees proposed by Lan Associates, and conducted a detailed fee review with Lan Associates. The deliverables were reviewed and the anticipated level of effort for each task was discussed comparing the effort Lan Associates proposed to the effort NJSDA estimated each task would require. This discussion revealed a clearer understanding of the work effort required and it was established that certain economies that had not been anticipated earlier by Lan Associates were available. Accordingly, Lan Associates revised its fee in response to NJSDA comments resulting in a reduction of \$76,470 to arrive at a revised total lump sum fee of \$321,139 for Design Consultant Predesign Phase Services for the Cleveland Street ES project. The negotiated fees are listed in Table 5 below:

Lan Associates confirmed that its revised Fee Proposal is inclusive of all predesign scope elements contained in the Contract Documents. The Program Operations Director, the Contract Management Director, and the Managing Director of Design consider the negotiated fee to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided and recommend award of the engagement for Design Consultant Predesign Phase Services to Lan Associates.

RECOMMENDED PROJECT BUDGET

The estimated cost of approximately \$23.3 million for the project reflected in the Project Planning Charter is inclusive of prior expenditures related to prior completed design, land acquisition and site

investigation related services, as well as estimated costs associated with acquisition and relocation of three properties adjacent to the school site necessary to accommodate the proposed addition. The budget is also inclusive of estimated future costs necessary for advancement of the current project scope. The estimated costs are based upon the application of planning estimates to the anticipated project scope.

RECOMMENDATION

The Members of the Authority are requested to approve the award of a contract to the firm with the highest Final Combined Score, Lan Associates, for a total lump sum fee of \$321,139, inclusive of \$200,000 in allowances, for Predesign Phase Services for the Cleveland Street ES project in the Orange Public School District. Prior to execution of the contract, the contract and related documentation will be reviewed and approved by the NJSDA Division of Chief Counsel. The Members are also requested to approve the Project Planning Charter for the Cleveland Street ES project.

If the NJSDA elects to continue the engagement with Lan Associates for Design and Construction Phase services for the selected project scope, we will seek further Board approval to negotiate a total lump sum fee for such services within an approved not to exceed amount. In accordance with the Operating Authority, NJSDA will provide notification to the Board of the final negotiated fee for Design and Construction Phase services.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Operating Authority of the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA) Board approval is required for the award of a design agreement with both predevelopment and design services and for project Planning Charters; and

WHEREAS, in March 2012 the Members of the Authority approved the SDA's 2012 Capital Plan which identified a project to address facility conditions deficiencies at the Orange Public Schools District's (District) Cleveland Elementary School; and

WHEREAS, working with representatives of the (District) and the New Jersey Department of Education (DOE), SDA staff has reviewed and validated District needs and preliminarily identified the recommended project scope to address those needs; and

WHEREAS, Cleveland Street Elementary School (the school) is a 41,400 square foot facility educating 306 students in Kindergarten through Grade 7; and

WHEREAS, prior to inclusion of the project in the 2012 Capital Plan, a Working Group comprised of District, DOE and SDA staff was convened to review and validate the conditions deficiencies and to identify project scope items necessary to be addressed at the school; and

WHEREAS, upon identification of those deficiencies, the Working Group reviewed and collaborated on the conditions for inclusion in the project scope and DOE performed an assessment of district enrollments and capacity; and

WHEREAS, following this assessment, DOE concluded that existing District facilities lack the capacity of approximately 485 students in grades Pre K to 12 and subsequent SDA site visits to all District schools validated the existence of District-wide overcrowding; and

WHEREAS, it was determined that advancement of projects that would solely address facilities conditions deficiencies would not address District-wide overcrowding needs and potential solutions were sought to address both the facilities conditions needs and alleviate the District-wide overcrowding; and

WHEREAS, the Working Group determined that the most efficient means of addressing Districtwide overcrowding at the high school grade level would be through the completion of addition and renovation projects at Cleveland Street Elementary School (the project) and Orange High School; and

WHEREAS, a competitive procurement process for pre-design phase design consultant services for the project was advertised on May 11, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the project background, project scope, scope of services and a detailed description of the procurement process followed are set forth in a memorandum presented to the Board on this date and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, management recommends award of the engagement for design consultant pre-design phase services to Lan Associates, the firm with the highest final combined score for a total lump sum fee of \$321,139 for pre-design services for the project; and

WHEREAS, at the time of review, Lan Associates confirmed that its fee proposal is inclusive of all pre-design scope elements contained in the contract documents and the Program Operations Director, Contract Management Director and Managing Director of Design consider the negotiated fee to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided and recommend award of the engagement for Design Consultant Pre-design Phase Services to Lan Associates; and

WHEREAS, prior to execution of the contract, the contract and related documentation will be reviewed and approved by the SDA Division of Chief Counsel.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Members of the Authority hereby authorize and approve the award of a contract to Lan Associates, the firm with the highest final combined score, for a total lump sum fee of \$321,139, inclusive of \$200,000 in allowances, for pre-design phase services and the Project Planning Charter for the Cleveland Street Elementary School addition-renovation project in the Orange Public School District, consistent with the memorandum presented to the Board on this date and incorporated herein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, prior to execution of the contract, the contract and related documentation will be reviewed and approved by the SDA Division of Chief Counsel.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately, but no action authorized herein shall have force and effect until 10 days, Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays excepted, after a copy of the minutes of the Authority meeting at which this resolution was adopted has been delivered to the Governor for his approval, unless during such 10 day period, the Governor shall approve same, in which case such action shall become effective upon such approval.

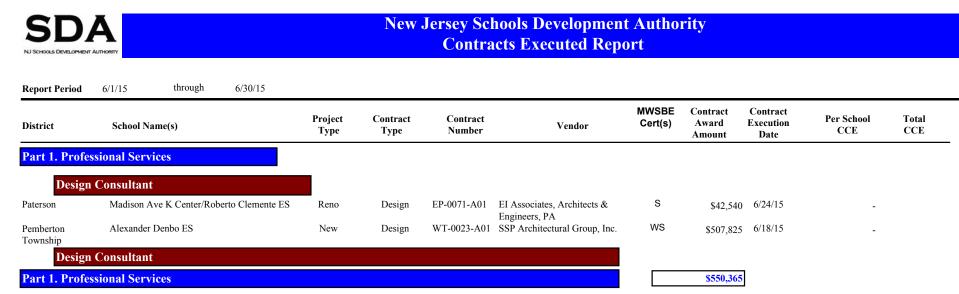

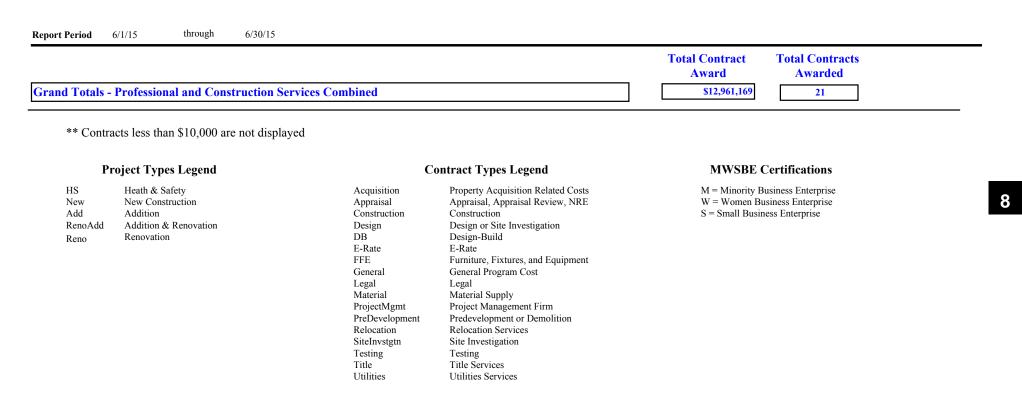

Vendor Services staff continues to participate at mandatory pre-bid and pre-construction meetings to instruct and inform bidders regarding SDA's SBE goals, policies and procedures, including:

- Small Business Enterprise subcontracting goal of 25% of all contracts
- County workforce goals for minorities and females
- Detailed process procedures to monitor and track the progress made toward these goals throughout the life cycle of each project

At these meetings, vendors are strongly encouraged to identify and hire minority-owned and womenowned firms, as well as locally-based enterprises, for diverse business participation on all school building projects. Additional outreach strategies are discussed and utilized.

SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (SBE) COMPLIANCE MONITORING

The SDA regularly exceeds the State-mandated 25% SBE goal. The total SDA contract dollars awarded through May 31, 2015 was \$16,815,840. The figures below demonstrate compliance with this requirement.

SDA Joins Paterson Officials for Beam Signing Event



On July 1, SDA CEO Charles McKenna joined local officials and Paterson School District leaders at a beam signing and "topping off" ceremony to highlight the progress of construction of the new P.S. 16 Elementary School. Immediately following the beam signing, attendees watched as the steel beam was hoisted into place, topping off and completing the steel erection for the school, and becoming a permanent part of its future gymnasium.

The new 109,500 square-foot Public School 16 is designed to educate approximately 700 students in

prekindergarten through eighth grades. The facility will include 22 general use classrooms, four prekindergarten classrooms, three kindergarten classrooms, specialized instruction classrooms and labs, a media center, a gymnasium and a cafetorium.

In addition to the beam signing ceremony, district representatives opened a time capsule from the original Public School 16 that was found during SDA's demolition of the facility. At time of demolition, the former PS 16 was over 100 years old. The contents of the time capsule included such items as multiple newspapers, annual reports for the Board of Education and the City of Paterson and pictures of the Board of Education Members – all dated 1891.

Christie Administration Tours Construction Activities for an Emergent Project in Vineland



On July 22, CEO Charles McKenna joined local and district officials to tour the construction of a significant emergent HVAC project at the Vineland High School South. Estimated at \$11.4 Million, the project will address improvements to the HVAC system and components. Work includes the removal of three steam boilers and associated piping, pumps and equipment; installation of a new hot water distribution system including boilers, water source heat pumps and associated equipment; and the Communications Report August 5, 2015 Page 2 of 2

installation of pneumatic control and building management systems.

The project is anticipated for completion in October 2016. Construction work will be phased throughout the school year to minimize any disruption to student learning.

The Office of the Chief Financial Officer is providing the attached monthly financial report to the Members of the Authority for their information. Included on pages 1 and 2 of this report is a "Financial Summary" of the Authority's activities for the year. On pages 3 and 4 of the report is a summary of the Authority's operating expenditures. Page 5 contains a breakdown of the Authority's headcount information by department/division. The basic financial statements follow on pages 6 and 7.

Year-to-Date Authority Operating Expenses (Actual vs. Budget)

For June 2015 year to date, Authority operating expenses, **\$9.4 million**, are **down \$2.2 million** as compared to the operating budget for the *corresponding period*. The deviation of actual expenses versus budget is due to:

- Lower salary & benefit costs **\$1.8 million.** The Authority is currently 26 FTEs under budget.
- Year to date spending reductions related to; MIS activity including system maintenance and hardware, **\$229K**, and Capitalized Expenditures, **\$192K**.

Year-to-Date Authority Operating Expenses (Actual vs. Prior Year Actual)

For June 2015 year to date, Authority operating expenses, **\$9.4 million**, are **\$170** lower as compared to the *corresponding prior year*.

Year-to-Date School Facilities Project Expenditures (Actual vs. Forecast)

For June 2015 year to date, project expenditures, **\$207 million**, are **down \$12 million** as compared to the capital spending forecast for the *corresponding period*. The variance is due to lower than anticipated expenditures in construction work **\$28M**, offset by an increase in grant spending **\$16M**.

Year-to-Date <u>School Facilities Project Expenditures</u> (Actual vs. Prior Year Actual)

For June 2015 year to date, project expenditures, **\$207 million**, has **increased** by **\$87M** as compared to the *corresponding prior year*. The year-over-year variance is attributable to increased spending in; construction activity **\$34M**, grant activity **\$15M**, project insurance **\$6M** (including the \$5M down payment for the 3 year OCIP renewal agreement, effective March 1, 2015), property acquisitions **\$28M** (including \$30M payment for the Paterson Catholic school), and other related project costs **\$4M**.

Other

Since program inception, 72% of the funds authorized for the SDA Districts have been disbursed. Additionally, since program inception 96% of all SDA disbursements relate to school facilities projects and 4% relate to Operating expense.

The estimated value of active school facilities projects is approximately \$2.2B.

- Capital Assets total \$343,569 (net of accumulated depreciation of \$6,495,128), consisting of leasehold improvements (SDA offices), and capitalized software, equipment, furniture and fixtures in support of SDA operations. Depreciation on capital assets is generally calculated using the straight-line method over the life of each asset. For the year to date, Capital Expenditures are \$0 and Depreciation Expense is \$42,475.
- ► Accrued Liabilities total \$66.1 million, as follows:
 - Accrued project costs of \$25.4 million consisting of unpaid invoices (\$11.9 million); and retainage (\$13.5 million).
 - Pollution remediation obligations (PRO) under GASB 49 net to \$18.2 million (PRO liability \$20.1 million, offset by expected cost recoveries of \$1.9 million).
 - Estimated liability for loss contingencies totaling \$4.1 million (contractor claims \$4.1 million).
 - Payroll related liabilities of \$1.3 million.
 - Post-employment benefits obligation of \$17.0 million.
 - Other accrued liabilities of \$0.1 million.
- **Deposits** total \$3.9 million, as follows:
 - \$3.9 million is held for local share agreements (pass-through item).
- ▶ The Authority's **Net Position** at month end is \$276.3 million.
