NEW JERSEY SCHOOLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 7, 2015

A meeting of the Board of Directors of the New Jersey Schools Development Authority ("SDA" or "the Authority") was held on Wednesday, October 7, 2015 at 9:00 A.M. at the offices of the Authority at 32 East Front Street, Trenton, New Jersey.

being a quorum of the Board. Mr. Egan, Ms. Hassett, Ms. Kutner, Mr. Lewis-Powder, Mr. McNamara, Mr. Murray and Mr. Vargas participated in the meeting by teleconference.

At the Chairman's request, Charles McKenna, chief executive officer (by teleconference); Jason Ballard, chief of staff; Andrew Yosha, executive vice president; Jane F. Kelly, vice president and assistant secretary; Donald Guarriello, vice president and chief financial officer; Raymond Arcario, vice president; Albert Barnes, chief counsel; and Susan Pacuta, director of the SDA participated in the meeting. Michael Collins of the Governor's Authorities Unit also participated in the meeting.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. Walsh, who requested that Ms. Kelly read the requisite notice of the meeting. Ms. Kelly announced that the meeting notice had been sent to the *Trenton Times* and *Star-Ledger* at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, and had been duly posted on the Secretary of State's bulletin board at the State House in Trenton, New Jersey.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Mr. Walsh presented for consideration and approval the Minutes of the Board's September 2, 2015 Open and Executive Session meetings. A copy of both meeting minutes and a resolution had been provided to the Members for review in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Luckie and seconded by Mr. Nixon, the Open and Executive Session minutes of the September 2, 2015 meeting were approved by the Board upon its unanimous vote in favor of the resolutions attached hereto as *Resolutions 3a/3b*.

Authority Matters CEO Report

The Chairman requested that Mr. McKenna provide the report of the Chief Executive Officer. Mr. McKenna updated the Members regarding the Trenton Central HS (TCHS) project. He said that four sections of the facility have now been abated and demolition activities are ongoing in the B and C Wings. He said that the SDA Design Studio is preparing bridging documents and incorporating final revisions into the schematic design documents which were the result of district and Department of Community Affairs (DCA) review. He noted that Department of Education (DOE) schematic approval is anticipated within the next week. Finally, he advised the Board that management advertised on September 29 for design-build services for the new high school.

Turning to other projects, Mr. McKenna said that work is proceeding on the Bridgeton Buckshutem Road ES and Bridgeton Quarter Mile Lane ES projects and that there are no major changes to report.

Mr. McKenna informed the Members that management issued a Notice to Proceed for pre-design services to the DIGroup (DIG) for the Camden HS project. He said the kick-off and first project meetings were held in September.

Regarding projects in the Elizabeth School District, Mr. McKenna said that all major trades continue to work well towards completion of the Academic HS project. He said that he, along with Mr. Arcario, recently inspected the project and it is moving along well. With regard to the Elizabeth New ES project, he noted that the design-builder's revised final design submission was resubmitted and is being reviewed.

Next, Mr. McKenna gave an update on the Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 project. He informed the Members that technical and price proposals for construction services were received on September 9 from five firms. He said that the selection committee reviewed the technical proposals and that price proposals were opened on September 24. Mr. McKenna reported that and Brockwell & Carrington Contractors, Inc. is the highest ranked bidder and that a contract award recommendation is on today's agenda. He advised the Board that a bid protest was filed in connection with this matter by Dobco and is under review by staff. He added that a Notice of Award (NOA) was issued to the McCloud Group to provide construction management services for the project.

In regard to the Gloucester ES/MS project, Mr. McKenna said that underground utility, footings and foundation installation work is on-going. He added that structural steel erection work is progressing well.

Mr. McKenna then reported that SDA's Design Studio is proceeding with the schematic design phase for the Harrison New ES project. He said that management anticipates advertising an early site package later this month.

Next, Mr. McKenna said that SDA's Design Studio is proceeding with the schematic design for the Irvington Madison Avenue ES project. He noted that the early site package was advertised on September 30. He added that management anticipates presenting a recommendation for award at the December Board meeting.

In continuing, Mr. McKenna said that concrete slab, exterior masonry, roof installation, HVAC, plumbing, and electrical work is all on-going for the Keansburg Caruso ES project. In regard to the Jersey City PS 20 and Jersey City ES No. 3 projects, he said that both jobs are progressing and there are no changes to report. He advised the Board that the preliminary schematic design submission is being reviewed for the existing Millville HS project. He reminded the Board that a contract award for design-build services was approved in September for the New Brunswick Paul Robeson ES project. He said that the NOA has been issued and staff anticipates issuance of the NTP later this month.

Turning to projects in the Newark School District, Mr. McKenna said that work continues on the Elliott Street ES and Oliver Street ES projects. He said that technical and price proposals for design-build services were received on September 16 from four firms for the South Street ES project. He added that the selection committee reviewed the technical proposals and price proposals were opened on September 25 for the project. He noted that Ernest Bock & Sons, Inc. is the highest ranked bidder and that a contract award recommendation is on today's agenda. Mr. McKenna advised the Board that a bid protest has been filed by Hall Construction in connection with this procurement and that it is currently under review.

In regard to projects in the Orange School District, Mr. McKenna said that pre-design services are on-going for the Orange HS project and that work is moving along well. He informed the Members that the initial project meeting to begin the pre-design phase was held for the Cleveland Orange ES project -- with SDA, district staff and LAN Associates.

Mr. McKenna then gave an update on projects in the Passaic School District. He said that a Temporary Certificate of Occupancy (TCO) was issued by DCA for the Passaic Gifted & Talented Academy (formerly known as the Henry Street ES) project and the school opened on September 9. He added that the SDA, DCA and PSE&G agreed on the installation of heat sensors in an electric power distribution room in order to comply with applicable codes. He said that this work has been completed, inspected and approved. He informed the Members that a ribbon cutting/school opening event was held on September 30 in which the Chairman of the Board participated. In regard to the Passaic Leonard Place ES project, Mr. McKenna said that SDA advertised for design-build services on August 13. He noted that technical and price proposals are due October 22.

Next, Mr. McKenna said that there are no changes to report regarding the Paterson Marshall Street ES project. He added that staff is closely monitoring the Paterson PS 16 project for compliance with the schedule, with special attention being given to achieving a weather tight building for the winter.

In regard to the Pemberton Denbo Crichton ES, Perth Amboy Seaman Avenue ES, Phillipsburg HS and Vineland New MS projects, Mr. McKenna said that there are no changes to report. In regard to the Perth Amboy Seaman Avenue ES project, he reported that efforts have been underway for over a year to secure the district's purchase of land from the Housing Authority to help with overcrowding in the school.

Turning to the Authority's ongoing procurement activity, Mr. McKenna said that, in addition to the Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 and Newark South Street ES projects that are on the meeting agenda, currently underway are procurements for the: Passaic Leonard Place ES project; Vineland MS No.2 project; TCHS project; Irvington Madison Avenue ES project; furniture, fixtures and equipment term contract and legal services.

Reporting on events, outreach and other activities, Mr. McKenna advised the Board that the only event that took place this month was a ribbon cutting ceremony for the new Passaic Gifted and Talented Academy.

Audit Committee

In place of Mr. Nixon, the Chairman then provided the report of the Audit Committee. Mr. Walsh advised the Board that the Audit Committee met on September 21, 2015. He said that management had provided the Committee with the August 2015 New Funding Allocation and Capital Plan Update. He said that management reported no changes in the Unforeseen Events and 2008 Capital Plan Emergent Project Reserve balances. He also reported a decrease of \$7.1 million in the Planning Reserve balance following Board approval of the final project charter for the New Brunswick addition and renovation project. Specifically, he advised the Board that the decrease was due to increased construction costs relating to the award to the design-builder and an increase in the budgets for furniture, fixtures, technology and equipment fit-out which reflected more recent project experience. Mr. Walsh reported that there was a \$300,000 decrease in the 2011 Capital Plan Emergent Projects Reserve balance due to the funding, approved by the CEO, for the Trenton (Hedgepeth-Williams School) emergent roof repairs project.

Mr. Walsh added that the reserve balance for the Regular Operating Districts ("RODs") increased by \$1.9 million during the reporting period due to a reduction in state share for grant projects nearing completion.

Next, Mr. Walsh reported that SDA's internal auditors presented the Committee with the results of the Construction Management (CM) Services Audit (the Audit). He asked Ms. Pacuta to provide additional comments. Ms. Pacuta explained that the Audit sought to identify the main reasons why CM services awards are made to CM firms that are not the low bidders. She said that 9 contracts were evaluated for the Audit. Ms. Pacuta advised the Board that there will be a follow-up discussion at the Audit Committee level. Mr. Walsh raised a related issue regarding how to ensure that selection teams can fairly evaluate CM applicants that previously have not worked on SDA projects when comparing them with those that previously have worked on SDA projects. Mr. Yosha noted that management is taking steps in this regard, including meeting with selection committee members and emphasizing the applicability/value of comparable non-SDA experience.

Next, Mr. Walsh reported that the Committee was provided with the August 2015 Monthly Financial Report. He said that, year-to-date, the Authority's operating expenditures total \$12.4 million which is \$2.3 million lower than the operating budget for the corresponding period. He said that the variance is attributable to lower salary and benefit costs. He reported that, as of August 2015, year-to-date project expenditures are \$280 million, down \$1.6 million as compared to the 2015 Capital spending forecast and \$108 million higher as compared to actual expenses in the corresponding prior year. He said that this is largely attributable to a \$50 million increase in spending for construction activity, \$19 million in grant activity, and \$7 million in project insurance (including the \$5 million down payment for the three-year OCIP renewal), along with property acquisition costs (including the \$30 million payment for the Paterson Catholie HS).

In conclusion, Mr. Walsh advised the Board that, since program inception, 73% of the funds authorized for the SDA districts have been disbursed. He reported that 96% of all SDA

disbursements relate to school facilities projects and 4% relate to program administrative and general expenses. Mr. Walsh reported that the estimated value of current school facilities project activity is approximately \$2.2 billion.

School Review Committee

Award of Construction and Approval of Final Project Charter – Garfield School District – New James Madison ES No. 10; Design-Build Award and Approval of Final Charter – Newark Public School District – New South Street ES

Mr. Walsh asked Mr. Luckie to provide the report of the School Review Committee. Mr. Luckie discussed management's request that the Board approve a contract award and final project charter for the Garfield New James Madison ES No. 10 project (the project). He reported that, when completed, the Garfield New James Madison Elementary School No. 10 will be an approximately 53,000 square foot facility designed to educate 275 students in grades Kindergarten through Five. He said that demolition and early site preparation work on the project was completed on March 27, 2015 and the award for construction management services was approved by the Board on August 5, 2015. He added that, on June 30, 2015, the bid advertisement for construction services for the project was issued with "price" equaling 90% of the overall weight, and all non-price factors having a combined weight of 10%. Mr. Luckie said that, upon completion of the procurement process for construction services, management recommends that the Board approve the award of a contract in the amount of \$16,725,000 to Brockwell & Carrington Contractors, Inc. He noted that the awardee will be required to perform a constructability review prior to initiation of construction to identify any potential conflicts and their resulting cost impacts. Mr. Barnes noted that a bid protest has been filed in this matter. Mr. Walsh then asked that the Members discuss the issues raised by the bid protest in Executive Session prior to voting on the contract award.

Next, Mr. Luckie discussed management's request that the Board approve a contract award for design-build services and the final project charter for the New South Street ES project (the project) in the Newark Public School District. He reported that in March 2012, the Members of the Authority approved the SDA's 2012 Capital Plan which included the Newark New South Street ES project for advancement. He informed the Members that the South Street School, an approximately 103,000 square foot facility designed to educate 597 students in grades Pre-K through 8, will be constructed on an SDA acquired site and will replace the existing South Street ES. He said that planning discussions held in 2011 among the district, DOE and SDA identified model and grade alignment adjustments to better suit the district's needs and enhance overall efficiencies. He noted that these adjustments were recognized in the 2012 Capital Plan. Mr. Luckie said the "Kit-of-Parts" approach developed by SDA was determined to be suitable for this project, and it was also determined advantageous to proceed by way of a two phase project advancement process. He noted that the current proposed final charter reflects final building size and student population, as well as better defined costs associated with construction and related activities. He added that demolition and early site preparation work for the project was completed on June 4, 2015. Mr. Luckie said that a package was advertised as a design-build solicitation on June 29, 2015 with "price" weighted as 60% of the overall weight, and "all nonprice factors" with a combined weight of 40%. He said that, following completion of the competitive procurement process, management recommends award of a contract in the amount of \$36,885,000 for design-build services for the project to Ernest Bock & Sons, Inc. He informed the Members that, at the time of review, Ernest Bock & Sons, Inc. confirmed that its price proposal is inclusive of all scope elements contained in the contract documents. Mr. Walsh suggested that the Members discuss this bid protest in Executive Session as well prior to voting on the matter.

Public Comments

The Chairman then opened the Public Comments portion of the meeting. He called upon Frank Faras of Trenton to address the Board.

Mr. Faras said that, for months, he has been expressing concerns that have gone unanswered regarding the TCHS project. He referenced a feasibility study that had been submitted in 2009 and stated that his concerns in this regard have been "brushed off". He said that the County Superintendent must approve the closure of a school facility and that this approval was not obtained in the case of TCHS. Additionally, he raised questions regarding the Trenton Public Schools District's (district) long range facilities plan and cited various statutes which he believes have been violated throughout the process. In conclusion, Mr. Faras requested a halt to the demolition of the TCHS facility and asked that the Board investigate the questionable practices he has cited. The Chairman and Mr. McKenna thanked Mr. Faras for his comments.

The Chairman then asked Billy Hayes of Trenton to address the Board. Mr. Hayes said that he would like to raise certain "equity" concerns given that the TCHS students are currently located at four different facilities. He also expressed concern that the established \$130 million budget will not cover the required space needs, particularly given that students have moved out from one of the four locations with the result that SDA is using project funds to pay for space that is not occupied. Mr. McKenna assured Mr. Hayes that the vacated space has been sublet and that these rental monies are being applied to the TCHS project budget. He also noted, for informational purposes, that the ongoing air monitoring results for the project site are available on the SDA website.

The Chairman suggested that Mr. Hayes' concerns regarding the sufficiency of the space to be provided are proper topics for discussion with the district. Mr. McKenna said that staff

conducts a review of anticipated space needs and cost per square foot prior to establishment of the budget. Mr. Walsh noted that adjustments deemed necessary in a given project budget are presented for Board consideration should they arise. He said that such adjustments, within reasonable parameters, are generally approved by the Board. No other member of the public stepped forward to address the Board.

Ms. Kelly announced that the Board would be adjourning into Executive Session. She said that management will be seeking Board authorization to tender a formal offer of judgment in a cost recovery litigation matter and to discuss deliberative issues related to the Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 and Newark New South Street ES project procurements. She said that the Board will vote in connection with each of these matters upon its return to Open Session.

Thereafter, upon motion and with unanimous consent, the meeting adjourned into Executive Session.

Following discussion in Executive Session, the Board returned to Open Session.

A resolution pertaining to management's request for authority to tender a formal offer of judgment in a cost recovery litigation matter had been provided to the Members in advance of the meeting. Upon a motion by Mr. Luckie and seconded by Mr. Nixon, the resolution attached hereto as *Exhibit A1*. was unanimously approved by the Board.

A resolution pertaining to the Award of Construction and Approval of Final Project Charter for the Garfield New James Madison ES No. 10 matter had been provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Nixon and seconded by Ms. Hassett the recommended construction award to Brockwell & Carrington Contractors, Inc. and final project charter for the Garfield New James Madison ES No. 10 project were approved with the Board's unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 6a*.

A resolution pertaining to the design-build award and approval of final charter for the New South Street ES in the Newark Public School District matter had been provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Nixon and seconded by Mr. Walsh the recommended design-build award to Ernest Bock & Sons, Inc. and final project charter for the Newark New South Street ES project were approved with the Board's unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 6b*.

Mr. Walsh then asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Upon motion by the Chairman and with unanimous consent, the meeting was adjourned.

Risk Management is requesting Board approval to renew various insurance policies to continue the NJSDA's Business and Real Estate Property and Casualty Insurance Program ("Insurance Program"). The renewal policies will be purchased pursuant to the second year of a three-year term for broker services with The Safegard Group, Inc. ("Safegard"). The renewal policies will have a one year term with an effective date of December 14, 2015, and the proposed cost is not to exceed \$771,000. The "Operating Authority By Level," adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended March 7, 2012, requires the approval by the Members of the Authority for a contract amendment of Goods and Services contracts that exceeds \$100,000.

BACKGROUND

In November 2014, the Board approved the award of the Business and Real Estate Property and Casualty Insurance broker services to Safegard for a three-year term. As part of their scope of services, Safegard was directed to purchase, on behalf of the Authority, various insurance policies included in the Authority's Insurance Program. The policies included in the Insurance Program are: Business Administration Package (this includes General Liability, Business Personal Property, Electronic Data Processing Property, Valuable Papers and Extra Expense); Automobile Liability; Worker's Compensation; Umbrella/Excess Liability; Public Officials' and Employment Practices Liability; General Liability for the Real Estate Owned (REO) inventory; and Property insurance for our Swing Space schools and other REO properties. Concurrently, in November 2014, the Board approved the purchase of various insurance policies for an annual term, effective December 14, 2014, at a cost not to exceed \$745,000.

DESCRIPTION

In preparation for the 2015-2016 Insurance Program renewal, Risk Management met separately with various NJSDA operating divisions in order to obtain key data and other information related to, among other things, potential recent changes in risk exposures. This information was provided to Safegard, which, in turn, provided the relevant information to the various insurers who were requested to provide policy quotations. Accordingly, the quoted premiums obtained by the Authority are based on its

assumed quantified risk exposures as of September 2015; policy premiums may be adjusted during the year if there is a change in quantified risk exposure (e.g., NJSDA purchases a new vehicle or sells surplus property). Presently, we believe that the Authority's identified risk exposures are reasonably quantified in the quoted premiums and that any exposure changes and related premium adjustments during the policy year will be funded from the allowance and endorsed onto the policies accordingly.

Safegard has presented the Authority with a proposal which outlines the limits, terms and conditions for renewing the Insurance Program, effective December 14, 2015. Attached for your information are Safegard's Executive and Coverage Summaries, which include a synopsis of the cost comparisons and program changes. The annual premium cost for the 2015-2016 Insurance Program, as outlined below, is inclusive of State of NJ surcharges and commissions.

The highlights of the Insurance Program renewal include:

- While Workers' Compensation estimated annual payroll has remained fairly constant, the premium has increased due to a few factors:
 - o The rates as published by the New Jersey Compensation Rating & Insurance Bureau (NJCRIB) have effectively increased by an average 3.2%
 - o The 2015 Experience Rating Modification (ERM) as promulgated by the NJCRIB has increased by 5% based on an increase of incurred loss experience over the past 3 years.

- Due to 20% of staff payroll being assigned to construction sites, Risk Management applied to the New Jersey Compensation Rating Bureau for a Construction Classification Premium Adjustment Credit. A 15% premium discount was granted, which partially offsets the rate and experience increases
- o In addition, the Worker's Compensation carrier agreed to maintain the 20% Scheduled Rating Credit, which is another factor that has countered the rate increase.
- Business Personal Property, which includes Improvements & Betterments, decreased by 6% from \$4,324,229 to \$4,070,129. In addition, the value of Electronic Data Processing inventory decreased 31% from \$1,808,239 to \$1,251,519.
- Presently, the Public Officials Liability policy extends coverage for Network Security & Privacy Liability subject to a \$1,000,000 sublimit and a \$200,000 deductible. Coverage protects the NJSDA for any actual or alleged breach of duty, neglect, act, error or omission that results in a Failure of Security or Privacy Peril. The NJSDA has requested a quote to further extend this coverage to include Cyber Extortion, Network Interruption and Security Failure/Privacy Event Management. The initial quote received is for an annual cost of \$16,000 which is now being considered relative to our risks and risk mitigation procedures implemented by our Information Systems Department.

RECOMMENDATION

Risk Management has reviewed Safegard's renewal recommendations and considerations. Based upon this review and our professional judgment, we are requesting that the Board approve the purchase of various Business and Real Estate insurance policies, for a one year policy term commencing December 14, 2015, at a cost not to exceed \$771,000, which is inclusive of an approximate 2.5% allowance for potential exposure increases (e.g., increases due to the acquisition of real and/or personal property, automobiles, payroll increases, etc.) during the policy term plus an additional \$16,000 for extended Cyber Security coverage in the event the Authority determines to purchase such coverage.

- ➤ Chubb is now including a Prohibition of Access endorsement on all renewal policies. This endorsement provides coverage for Business Income and Extra Expense loss you incur due to the actual impairment of your operations, directly caused by the prohibition of access to an insured premises by a civil authority. The limit included in the form is \$50,000 per occurrence / \$100,000 annual aggregate. A copy of the endorsement is included. Please review for all terms and conditions. - ➤ Chubb applied the standard policy rate of \$149 per square foot to the Parking Lots at 1 West Lafayette St., 16 E. - ➤ AIG closed a claim (Date of Loss 4/14/2011) for Wrongful Termination, Gender/Race Discrimination and Retaliation on May 6, 2015. The total amount paid for the claim was \$124,755.67. At last year's quote date, the total amount paid was \$1,580.65.
- ➤ AIG originally requested a 10% rate increase as a result of claim activity. Safegard was successful in mitigating the increase to 3%.

ADDITIONAL COVERAGE CONSIDERATIONS

- ➤ **Pollution Liability** As discussed in previous meetings, virtually all forms of property and liability insurance contracts, including your current policies, contain exclusions for pollution, mold, and microbial matter. We suggest completing a pollution liability application in order to obtain a quotation for this coverage.
- ➤ Flood Flood Zones which are excluded from coverage under the Real Estate Property policy are "All A, B, Shaded X and V Flood Zones and any other zone with a greater than .2% chance of flooding as delineated by the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP)." Flood coverage for all properties not located in an excluded flood zone has a maximum limit of \$2,500,000 for each occurrence. Additional limits can be quoted upon request.

AIG has advised that they can provide enhanced Network Security/Cyber Liability coverage for an additional premium of \$16,062 that adds the following to the existing coverage:

- Cyber Extortion: Pays losses for monies paid by an Insured with the Insurer's prior written consent to terminate or end a Security Threat or Privacy Threat that would otherwise result in harm to an insured and the costs to conduct an investigation to determine the cause of a Security Threat or Privacy Threat. (Premium: \$1,007)
- *Network Interruption*: Pays costs that would not have been incurred but for a Material Interruption, Net Income that would have been earned and continuing normal operating expenses incurred, including payroll as a result of a Security Failure. Coverage is provided from the beginning of a Material Interruption through the 120th day after the end of the Material Interruption. (Premium: \$5,035)
- Security Failure/Privacy Event Management: Covers expenses and costs (within 1 year of discovery) for notification to third parties of actual or potential breach of Confidential Information due to Security Failure or Privacy Event. Also pays costs to conduct an investigation into the cause, use of an outside firm to minimize reputational damage and restore public confidence and expenses related to credit monitoring, victim reimbursement insurance, etc. Coverage also includes costs associated with restoration, recreation or recollection of Electronic Data. (Premium: \$10,020)

WHEREAS, in November 2014, the Members of the Authority approved a contract award for Business and Real Estate Property and Casualty Insurance broker services to The Safegard Group, Inc. (Safegard) for a three-year term; and

WHEREAS, as part of their scope of services, Safegard was directed to purchase on behalf of the Authority various insurance policies included in the Insurance Program which are described in detail in the materials presented to the Board on this date and incorporated herein; and

Legal Services

INTRODUCTION

The NJSDA previously procured legal services in 2008, 2011 and 2013 to complement legal support provided to the NJSDA through its Division of Chief Counsel and through the Division of Law in the Office of the Attorney General. Since the current task order contracts will expire in November 2015, the Members of the Authority are requested to approve the retention of a new group of sixteen (16) law firms with legal expertise in the following specific areas: (1) Insurance Coverage and Suretyship; (2) Bankruptcy and Insolvency Proceedings; (3) Environmental Law; (4) Employment Law; (5) Government Contracting, Bid Protests and Procurement; (6) Professional Errors and Omissions and Cost Recovery; (7) Construction Litigation; and (8) Real Estate Law. Specific work assignments under the contracts will be made by way of "task order" on an as needed basis. The term of agreement for these contracts is two (2) years. For any assignment(s) accepted during the term of the agreement, the firm(s) will be allowed to complete the particular assignment(s), even if extending beyond the term of the agreement.

The selected law firms may be asked, on an as needed basis, to assist the NJSDA's Division of Chief Counsel and to provide legal advice, consultative services, and, when required, formal representation of the NJSDA. Selection of a firm, however, does not guarantee that the firm will be assigned work. Task order assignments will be made on a rotating basis within the eight (8) specialty areas and multiple matters may be included as part of a single task order assignment. Assignments will be made subject to firm availability and a conflict of interest check. Firms will be required to submit a proposed budget for each task order assignment. The budget shall be subject to the NJSDA's approval and acceptance prior to commencement of services under the task order assignment.

Additionally, as described in the Request for Proposals ("RFP"), each selected firm must comply with the NJSDA Legal Services Management Guidelines and agree to provide its services at a blended hourly rate of \$200 for attorney services and an hourly rate of \$90 for paralegal services. These rates are the same as those utilized for the 2008, 2011 and 2013 legal services task order contracts. Total compensation to an individual Firm, regardless of whether it is engaged in one or more of the specialty areas, shall not exceed \$1,500,000 for the two (2) year term.

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Under the 2008 legal services procurement, the NJSDA issued a total of thirty-one (31) task orders in five (5) legal specialty areas with billings totaling approximately \$2,425,000 through October 7, 2015. Under the 2011 legal services procurement, the NJSDA issued a total of thirteen (13) task orders in five (5) legal specialty areas with billings totaling approximately \$2,141,000 through October 7, 2015. And under the 2013 legal services procurement, the NJSDA issued a total of ten (10) task orders in six (6) legal specialty areas with billings totaling approximately \$177,000 through October 7, 2015.

PROCUREMENT PROCESS

In accordance with NJSDA regulations, the NJSDA employed a two-step process for this procurement. The first step was the issuance of an RFP and evaluation of all responsive submissions. The second step was to interview all firms submitting responsive proposals.

The RFP was advertised beginning on July 17, 2015 on NJSDA's website, the New Jersey State website, and in the New Jersey Law Journal.

A Selection Committee consisting of three (3) NJSDA staff members was established.

Firms interested in submitting a proposal were required to send an e-mail giving Notice of Intent to Participate (NOI) by July 28, 2015. NOIs were received from thirty-two (32) firms. Responsive proposals were received from twenty-six (26) firms by August 14, 2015. Proposals were evaluated by the Selection Committee. Evaluations were based upon the information provided by the firms in response to the RFP for this project. The three (3) committee members independently evaluated the proposals per legal specialty area based on the following criteria:

- Understanding of the Purposes of the Engagement
- Firm Experience Case Studies
- Experience of Key Team Members
- Approach to Providing the Required Scope of Services

Each Selection Committee member evaluated each proposal per legal specialty area, assigning a raw score for each criterion on a scale of 0 to 10 as follows:

- Outstanding (9-10): depth and quality of response offers significant advantages.
- Superior (7-8): exceeds RFP requirements with no deficiencies.
- Sufficient (5-6): meets RFP requirements with no significant deficiencies.
- Minimal (3-4): meets RFP requirements but contains some significant deficiencies.
- Marginal (1-2): comprehends intent of RFP but contains many significant deficiencies.
- Unsatisfactory (0): requirements not addressed and lack of detail precludes adequate evaluation.

Weighting factors were applied to each of the Selection Committee member's raw scores for each criterion to arrive at a total weighted score as follows:

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Criteria	Weighting Factor (Applied to Raw Score)	Maximum Weighted Points
Understanding of the Purposes of the Engagement	0.5	5
Firm Experience - Case Studies	3.5	35
Experience of Key Team Members	3.5	35
Approach to Providing the Required Scope of Services	2.5	25

For each firm's proposal, the individual criteria scores awarded by a particular Selection Committee member for each legal specialty area were added together to calculate a Proposal Score for that legal specialty area. Each firm could receive a maximum of 100 points per evaluator, or 300 points total per legal specialty area.

The firms participated in interviews with the Selection Committee from September 22 through October 1, 2015, as applicable. The interviews allowed the firms to expand and detail their team experience and approach with respect to each legal specialty area. The Selection Committee interviewed each of the firms and evaluated each firm on Interview Criteria and Weighting Factors that were the same as those used in the evaluation of the proposals, as detailed above.

The individual criteria scores awarded by a particular Selection Committee member for each legal specialty area were added together to calculate an Interview Score for that legal specialty area. Each firm could receive a maximum of 100 points per evaluator, or 300 points total per legal specialty area.

The Proposal Score and the Interview Score assigned each firm were added together to obtain the firm's Final Combined Score. The maximum Final Combined Score is 600. The Final Combined Scores and Final Rankings are listed in Tables 1-8 below:

Vendor Services staff continues to participate at mandatory pre-bid and pre-construction meetings to instruct and inform bidders regarding SDA's SBE goals, policies and procedures, including:

- Small Business Enterprise subcontracting goal of 25% of all contracts
- County workforce goals for minorities and females
- Detailed process procedures to monitor and track the progress made toward these goals throughout the life cycle of each project

At these meetings, vendors are strongly encouraged to identify and hire minority-owned and womenowned firms, as well as locally-based enterprises, for diverse business participation on all school building projects. Additional outreach strategies are discussed and utilized.

SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (SBE) COMPLIANCE MONITORING

The SDA regularly exceeds the State-mandated 25% SBE goal. The total SDA contract dollars awarded through August 31, 2015 was \$67,995,213. The figures below demonstrate compliance with this requirement.

SBE Breakdown

The total contract dollars awarded to all SBE contractors was \$31,229,644 (including minorities, women and veteran owned businesses). This represents 45.94% of all SDA contracts.

This report summarizes the Regular Operating District Grant activity from inception to date and for the month of September 2015. Also included is a detailed list of grants executed and grants offered during the reporting period.

Monthly Update:

- o No new grants were offered during the reporting period.
- o 30 grants impacting 10 districts were executed during the reporting period representing \$13.2M in total project costs and state share of \$5.6M.
- o 11 grants impacting 7 districts were closed out during the reporting period representing \$7.5M in total project costs and state share of \$2.5M.
- o Since inception, over \$2.5B has been disbursed to 523 regular operating districts through the grant program.
- Since inception over \$3.3B in funding has been approved by the Department of Education and offered to regular operating districts through the grant program.

Lieutenant Governor Guadagno Celebrates the Opening of the New Passaic Gifted and Talented Academy



On September 30, Lieutenant Governor Kim Guadagno joined New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA) CEO Charles McKenna, Passaic Public Schools' representatives and state and local officials to celebrate the opening of the new Passaic Gifted and Talented Academy.

The 115,700 square-foot Passaic Gifted and Talented Academy educates 780 students in grades two through eight. The school includes a three-story Academic/Administrative wing and a two-story wing with a cafetorium, gymnasium, and specialized classrooms. The school has a media center, computer-aided design lab, video lab, instrumental and vocal music rooms, a dance studio with a stage, and art rooms, including one with a kiln. The school houses the District's Magnet program with a focus on Academics, Performing Arts, Physical Education, and Visual Arts.

SUBJECT: Monthly Financial Report - September 2015

The Office of the Chief Financial Officer is providing the attached monthly financial report to the Members of the Authority for their information. Included on pages 1 and 2 of this report is a "Financial Summary" of the Authority's activities for the year. On pages 3 and 4 of the report is a summary of the Authority's operating expenditures. Page 5 contains a breakdown of the Authority's headcount information by department/division. The basic financial statements follow on pages 6 and 7.

Year-to-Date Authority Operating Expenses (Actual vs. Budget)

For September 2015 year to date, Authority operating expenses, **\$13.2 million**, are **down \$3 million** as compared to the operating budget for the *corresponding period*. The deviation of actual expenses versus budget is due to:

- Lower salary & benefit costs **\$2.4 million.** The Authority is currently 23 FTEs under budget. This variance is offset by the year to date allocation of payroll expense to project cost that is lower than projected, **(\$569K)**;
- Year to date spending reductions for DAG Legal Services, \$90K, MIS system maintenance and hardware, \$353K and General Office & Facility Expenditures, \$320K and
- Timing Differences; The purchase of the eDCM Archive system, **\$274K**, has been rescheduled for the fall of 2015.

Year-to-Date Authority Operating Expenses (Actual vs. Prior Year Actual)

For September 2015 year to date, Authority operating expenses, **\$13.2 million**, are **\$240K** lower as compared to the *corresponding prior year*.

Year-to-Date School Facilities Project Expenditures (Actual vs. Forecast)

For September 2015 year to date, project expenditures, \$307.4 million, are down \$4.5 million as compared to the capital spending forecast for the *corresponding period*. The variance is due to lower than anticipated expenditures in construction work \$20.5M, offset by an increase in grant spending \$16M.

Year-to-Date School Facilities Project Expenditures (Actual vs. Prior Year Actual)

For September 2015 year to date, project expenditures, **\$307.4 million**, has **increased** by **\$105.3M** as compared to the *corresponding prior year*. The year-over-year variance is attributable to increased spending in; construction activity **\$51.8M**, grant activity **\$19.1M**,

project insurance \$7.1M (including the \$5M down payment for the 3 year OCIP renewal agreement, effective March 1, 2015), and property acquisitions \$27.8M (which includes the \$30M payment for the Paterson Catholic school).

Other

Since program inception, 73% of the funds authorized for the SDA Districts have been disbursed. Additionally, since program inception 96% of all SDA disbursements relate to school facilities projects and 4% relate to Operating expense.

The estimated value of active school facilities projects is approximately \$2.2B.

Re: Report On Completed Executive Session Matters

Section 3.6 of the Bylaws of the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (NJSDA) authorizes the conduct of certain business of the Authority in Executive Session. Pursuant to Section 3.7 of the Bylaws, the Board shall determine when those matters discussed in Executive Session are appropriate for release in Open Session.

Attached is a list of certain matters that were the subject of discussion in Executive Session meetings of the Board held between January 2008 and September 2014. It has been determined that the handling of these matters has now been completed. As such, it is recommended that the resolution of the items listed on the attached be released by the Authority in the Open Session of the November 4, 2015 meeting of the NJSDA Board of Directors. Minutes relating to these matters or any portion other of that are exempt from disclosure under the Open Public Records Act, pursuant to attorney-client privilege or in accordance with other applicable law shall remain exempt from disclosure, notwithstanding the release in Open Session.
