APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

JULY 5, 2017 OPEN SESSION

NEW JERSEY SCHOOLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING WEDNESDAY, JULY 5, 2017

A teleconference meeting of the Board of Directors of the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA or the Authority) was held on Wednesday, July 5, 2017 at 9:00 A.M. at the offices of the Authority at 32 East Front Street, Trenton, New Jersey.

being a quorum of the Board. Mr. Luckie and Mr. Vargas participated in the meeting in person.

At the Chairman's request, Charles McKenna, chief executive officer; Andrew Yosha, executive vice president; Jane F. Kelly, vice president and assistant secretary; Donald Guarriello, vice president and chief financial officer; Manuel Da Silva, vice president; Albert Barnes, chief counsel; and Gregory Voronov, managing director of the SDA participated in the meeting. Thomas Huth of the Governor's Authorities Unit also participated in the meeting by teleconference.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. Walsh, who requested that Ms. Kelly read the requisite notice of the meeting. Ms. Kelly announced that the meeting notice had been sent to the *Trenton Times* and *Star-Ledger* at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, and had been duly posted on the Secretary of State's bulletin board at 33 West State Street in Trenton, New Jersey. Ms. Kelly then conducted a roll call and indicated that a quorum of the Members was present.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Mr. Walsh presented for consideration and approval the minutes of the Board's June 7, 2017 Open and Executive Session meetings. A copy of both meetings' minutes and a resolution had been provided to the Members for review in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Nixon and seconded by Mr. Luckie, the June 7, 2017 Open and Executive Session meeting minutes were approved by the Board upon its unanimous vote in favor of the resolution attached hereto as *Resolution 3a/3b*.

Authority Matters

CEO Report

At the Chairman's request, Mr. McKenna provided the Members with the report of the CEO. Mr. McKenna began the report with an update on the Trenton Central HS (TCHS) project. He reported that the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) reviewed and issued comments on the final building design documents that are being incorporated by the design-builder. He added that a resubmission will be made to DCA within the next few weeks.

Turning to projects in the Bridgeton School District, Mr. McKenna said that for the Buckshutem Road ES and the Quarter Mile Lane ES projects, SDA staff submitted applications for certificates of occupancy (CO) for both projects.

Mr. McKenna reported that for the Camden HS project, SDA staff advertised a demolition package in June and price proposals are due July 25. For the East Orange George Washington Carver ES project, he said that SDA staff issued a notice of award to design-builder Dobco, Inc., on June 23. Mr. McKenna informed the Members that substantial completion is scheduled for the end of this month for the Elizabeth New ES project. He said that furniture, fixtures, equipment and IT work is scheduled to be completed in August for a September opening of the facility.

With respect to the Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 project, Mr. McKenna said that exterior veneer work continues to progress well. For the Harrison New ES project, he reported that SDA staff accepted Brockwell & Carrington's preliminary design submission and it will be submitted to the DCA for review and release. He added that three structures on adjoining sites have been demolished and backfilling activities are underway.

Mr. McKenna said that design phase services continue for the Irvington Madison Avenue ES project and a limited notice to proceed (NTP) was issued June 8 to Epic Management, Inc. for construction management (CM) services. For the Keansburg Port Monmouth Road ES project, he reported that schematic design phase services are complete and design development phase services have initiated.

Mr. McKenna informed the Members that the district is occupying the Jersey City ES No. 3 facility. He added that punch-list and closeout phase work is ongoing. For the addition and renovation project at the Millville HS, he said that Hall Construction is currently performing on-

site investigations to confirm existing conditions. He added that SDA staff advertised for CM services the previous week.

Mr. McKenna reported that for the New Brunswick Paul Robeson ES project, masonry, HVAC, electrical and plumbing work is ongoing. For the Newark South Street ES project, he said that rooftop unit delivery and installation are ongoing and roofing and exterior veneer installation has begun.

Turning to projects in the Orange School District, Mr. McKenna informed the Members that for the Cleveland ES project, the design consultant is finalizing the design development phase. He said that SDA staff issued an NTP for abatement, demolition and site improvements to Yannuzzi Group (Yannuzzi) on June 5. He said that the Yannuzzi will be demolishing the 3 buildings that are adjacent to the Cleveland ES, thus permitting the addition and renovation work to proceed. For the Orange HS project, the design consultant is finalizing the schematic design phase.

In continuing, Mr. McKenna gave an update on projects in the Passaic School District. He said that concrete deck work is progressing for the Leonard Place ES project. With respect to the Dayton Avenue Educational Campus project, he reported that SDA staff advertised the design-build services procurement package for bid on June 13 and held the pre-bid meeting at the site on June 29. He said that technical and price proposals are due September 7.

Mr. McKenna reported that for the Paterson Union Avenue MS project (former site of Don Bosco Academy), SDA staff held the kickoff meeting for demolition services on June 14. He added that the contractor is preparing to mobilize mid-July. For the Pemberton Denbo Crichton ES project, he said that temporary space is being readied for the upcoming school year. He noted that design-build bid documents are being finalized. In regard to the Perth Amboy

Seaman Avenue ES project, he said that design phase services are ongoing and site utility installation has commenced.

With respect to the Vineland New MS project, Mr. McKenna reported that masonry, steel erection, roofing, electrical, plumbing, and HVAC work are all ongoing and site paving, curbing and exterior veneer work has commenced.

In continuing, Mr. McKenna informed the Members that for the West New York Harry L. Bain PS No. 6 project, phased turnover of the facility to the district has begun. He said that the turnover will be complete for a September reopening by the district.

Mr. McKenna then reminded the Members that a classroom ceiling had collapsed at the Salem MS. He said the he and the Senate President are looking at a building run by the diocese to lease, which may offer a better option than utilization of temporary classroom units.

Turning next to ongoing procurement activity, Mr. McKenna said that activity currently underway includes procurements for: design-build services for the Passaic Dayton Avenue Educational Campus project; demolition services for the Camden HS project; CM services for the Millville HS project; site consultant services; legal services; OCIP IV broker services; and business, real estate property & casualty insurance broker services.

Reporting on events, outreach and other SDA activities, Mr. McKenna said that SDA staff held a community meeting in Perth Amboy on June 13 to discuss the start of construction of the new Seaman Avenue School. He added that SDA staff also attended a couple of community meetings in Camden on June 21 to provide an update on the status of the new Camden HS project.

Mr. McKenna informed the Committee that SDA vice president Manny Da Silva received the 2017 Estralas do Condado de Essex at the Annual Essex County Portuguese Heritage Celebration on Wednesday, June 14.

Mr. McKenna said that the SDA had issued its Biannual Report the previous month and noted that it is available for review on the SDA website.

Finally, Mr. McKenna advised the Members that Communications staff is working to schedule a groundbreaking ceremony later in the month for the Perth Amboy Seaman Avenue School project.

Audit Committee Report

The Chairman then requested that Mr. Nixon provide the report of the Audit Committee. Mr. Nixon reported that the Audit Committee met on June 19, 2017. He said that management provided the Committee with the May 2017 New Funding Allocation and Capital Plan Update. He advised the Board that only one change had occurred in SDA District Reserve Balances during the reporting period. Specifically, he reported that the 2011 Emergent Projects Reserve experienced a decrease of \$1.9 million due to the release of funds for structural repair work at the Camden Cramer ES. Additionally, he reported that the reserve balance for the Regular Operating Districts ("RODs") decreased by \$200,000 during the reporting period. He explained that this was due to the release of \$1.3 million to address HVAC corrective work at the Egg Harbor City MS, offset by a \$1.1 million increase due to reductions in state share for grant projects nearing completion.

Next, Mr. Nixon advised the Members that the Board will need to take action in connection with one item. He explained that the Audit Committee is recommending approval of a 2-year contract extension for Ernst & Young (E&Y) for independent auditor services and other

services required by the Committee. Referencing materials that previously had been provided for Board review, he reminded the Board that in 2014, after a competitive procurement process, and in compliance with Executive Order 122, SDA retained E&Y for independent auditor services. He advised that the initial term of the contract is expiring but explained that the contract provides the Authority with the option to extend the agreement for two one-year periods. He said that the cost of the extension years is \$109,500 for 2017 and \$113,500 for 2018. Mr. Nixon said that the Committee believes that exercising the SDA's option to extend is prudent for a number of reasons. He said that the Audit Committee works well with E&Y, that E&Y knows the staff and the organization extremely well and that that E&Y has always provided the services without issues. He said that the Committee has concluded that it would be disruptive at this time to go out to bid. Mr. Nixon said that the Committee is recommending that the Authority exercise its option for both years 2017 and 2018. Mr. Vargas asked if a new bid process will proceed following the 5 year period. Mr. Nixon responded in the affirmative.

A resolution pertaining to this matter had been provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. After discussion, upon motion duly made by Mr. Luckie and seconded by Mr. Vargas, the proposed Ernst & Young 2017 and 2018 contract extension for Financial Statement Audit Services was approved with the Board's unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 5a*.

In continuing, Mr. Nixon noted that the Authority's internal auditing unit informed the Committee of the closure of more than 60 audit recommendations. He commended the excellent work of the internal auditing unit.

Mr. Nixon then provided the May 2017 Monthly Financial Report. He advised that the Authority's operating expenses (Actual vs. Budget) for the year-to-date period totaled \$9.7 million, which is down \$1 million as compared to the budget for the corresponding period. He

explained that the decrease is mainly attributable to lower salaries and benefit costs. He said that school facilities project expenditures (Actual vs. Forecast) for the year-to-date period total \$157.5 million and are \$17.4 million higher as compared to the capital spending forecast for the corresponding period. Mr. Nixon then reported that project expenditures (Actual vs. Prior Year Actual), at \$157.5 million, are \$2.2 million higher as compared to the corresponding prior year period. He explained that the variance is due to increased spending on grant activity offset by decreases in construction costs and other project related costs. In conclusion, Mr. Nixon reported that, since program inception, approximately 78.4% of the funds allocated for SDA districts have been disbursed. Additionally, he said that, since program inception, 96% of all SDA disbursements relate to school facilities projects, while 4% relate to operating expenses. He advised that the estimated value of current school facilities project activity is approximately \$2.2 billion.

School Review Committee

2012 Capital Plan Amendment – Hoboken School District – Substitution of Project; Release of Funds from Program Reserve – Newark Public Schools District – Hawthorne Avenue Elementary School – Emergent Project – Exterior Masonry and Roof Replacement; Egg Harbor Township High School – Change Order – Delric Construction Company, Inc.

Mr. Walsh asked Mr. Luckie to provide the report of the School Review Committee. Mr. Luckie said that the Committee met on June 19, 2017. He said that the first matter for Board consideration is a proposed amendment to the SDA's 2012 Capital Plan whereby one project will be substituted for another project in the Hoboken School District. He reported that the Authority's 2012 Capital Plan included a project to address facilities conditions deficiencies at the Hoboken Thomas G. Connors ES (the Connors School). He said that the Connors School educates 314 students in grades Pre-K through 6. Mr. Luckie explained that, after approval of

the Capital Plan, school district, City, Department of Education (DOE) and SDA staff reviewed and validated district needs. He advised the Members that this process revealed that the Connors School is located entirely within a 100-year floodplain area that has been Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)-designated as a "Special Flood Hazard Area - High Risk". Mr. Luckie said that the Connors School has experienced flooding in the past and is anticipated to experience such flooding in the future. He reported that regulatory limitations imposed due to the Connors School's location have negatively affected the value and extent of renovations that can be completed there resulting in a reduction in the School's educational capacity. He said that the working group concluded that the district's A.J. Demarest School (Demarest School) is appropriate as a substitute for the Connors School based upon its capacity, core group spaces, facility conditions, cost and FEMA floodplain classification. Mr. Luckie informed the Members that SDA management recommends advancement of a project at the Demarest School to substitute for the previously identified Connors School and is requesting that the Board approve an amendment to the Capital Plan for this reason. He said that the estimated funding necessary to complete the anticipated work at the Demarest facility is consistent with the estimated costs that previously had been allocated for work at the Connors School. Mr. Voronov noted that the Demarest School is actually more spacious than the Connors School and is thus a good choice to substitute for that school.

A resolution pertaining to this matter had been provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Vargas and seconded by Mr. Piaia, the proposed amendment to the SDA's 2012 Capital Plan for the Hoboken School District was approved with the Board's unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 6a*.

At the Chairman's request, Mr. Luckie discussed management's recommendation for a release of funds from the program reserve for the Newark Hawthorne Avenue ES emergent project (the Project). He advised the Board that the Hawthorne Avenue ES (Hawthorne School) is an approximately 81,000 square foot facility that educates 390 students in grades Pre-K to 8. He said that following joint site visits by SDA and DOE staff to review the district's potential emergent conditions, DOE issued pre-construction approval in July 2012 for an emergent project to address conditions related to the building's exterior masonry and roofing system. Mr. Luckie informed the Members that, in March 2013, after receipt of pre-construction approval, SDA issued a grant offer to the district to allow for the advancement of the Project by way of SDA delegation for district management. He said that the Project was placed on hold after the grant was executed while the district reviewed and assessed its buildings and planned for their future use. He said that in May 2016, the district advised SDA that it would be continuing to use the Hawthorne School as a school facility for the near future and that the masonry and roof work had to proceed for the continued operation of the school. Mr. Luckie advised that SDA staff has reviewed the Project scope to ensure that it adequately addresses the identified conditions and does not include work above that required to remedy those conditions. He added that staff also reviewed the construction cost estimate and other costs and concluded that the cost of the Project, including appropriate contingency, is \$1,758,000.

A resolution pertaining to this matter had been provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Vargas and seconded by Mr. Walsh and with Mr. Lewis-Powder recused and abstaining, the release of funds from the program reserve for the Newark Hawthorne Avenue ES emergent project was approved with the Board's unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 6b*.

At Mr. Walsh's request, Mr. Luckie next discussed management's recommendation for a proposed change order required as the result of a modification to the scope of remedial work to address a roof condition at the Egg Harbor Township HS project (the Project). Mr. Luckie advised the Board that the Committee held a special meeting on June 29, 2017 to consider this matter. He said that in May 2012, SDA completed an 115,000 square foot addition to the existing Egg Harbor Township HS, which included the construction and installation of a standing seam metal roof. He said that, subsequently, the ceilings of upper floor classrooms and other locations at the school exhibited moisture damage due to condensation. He said that it was determined that the condensation problems were the result of design errors and omissions and construction defects, and that litigation ensued. He said that the Authority determined that the underlying condensation condition needed to be remediated while the litigation was pending. Mr. Luckie reported that in August 2016, the Board approved staff's use of the General Construction Services Task Order contract to delineate the existing facilities conditions, to develop and assess corrective options and to advance the most appropriate scope of work to correct the deficiencies. He advised that Delric Construction Company, Inc. (Delric) received the rotational assignment. Mr. Luckie said that site visits were conducted this past December and January to review the building roof and other conditions and to discuss options for performing the corrective work. He informed the Members that Delric provided the SDA with a cost estimate to complete the entirety of the scope of work in the not-to-exceed amount of \$1,141,371 and the Board approved this in March 2017. He explained that, later, SDA received the Final Emergent Conditions Report from Delric outlining three (3) corrective options to remedy the existing roof condition per Delric's scope of work and determined that option No. 2 was the best option to address the roof work. He advised that this final recommended and

accepted option includes additional scope of work beyond the option that Delric had used as the basis for the Project cost proposal. He said that it is necessary to revise the Project's scope and authorize Change Order No. 1 in order to provide additional funds in the amount of \$160,213.49 to advance the Project. He said that Board approval is also being sought to reestablish the construction contract value to equal the contract value inclusive of Change Order No. 1.

A resolution pertaining to this matter had been provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Vargas and seconded by Mr. Piaia, the Board approved Change Order No. 1 for the Egg Harbor HS emergent project with the Members' unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 6c*.

Public Comments

The Chairman then opened the Public Comments portion of the meeting. At the Chairman's request, Ms. Kelly called on Mr. Frank Faras, a resident of the City of Trenton, to address the Board. She said that, prior to the meeting, Mr. Faras had provided a handout that was distributed to the Members. She said that, following the meeting, the handout will be forwarded to those Members who are participating in the meeting telephonically.

Mr. Faras advised the Board that he lives across the street from the TCHS project/demolition site. He referenced the photos (handout) that had been distributed to the Members. He said that the photos depict two concrete towers that had been erected on the project site the previous month and were used to mix cement. He said that the photos also show clouds of material that travel across the street coating his house and his car. He said that on summer mornings it is possible to smell and taste the material. Mr. Faras said that Mr. McKenna has stated that he doesn't believe that the material is carcinogenic or very serious.

Mr. Faras then referenced the particular sheet of the handout which provides safety data prepared by the manufacturer of the concrete material. He said that this data sheet reflects that the material is classified as "1A" which, following testing on human beings, is globally recognized by the federal Environmental Protection Agency, Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) and state Department of Environmental Protection as carcinogenic for humans. He said that he "wants this stopped". He said that he has asked repeatedly for this to stop and thought, at first, that SDA's failure to do so was just "incompetence". He said that he now believes that it is "gross negligence" on the Authority's part. He said the Members should understand that the neighborhood does not want this. He asked that the Authority "make it stop today".

Next, Ms. Kelly asked that Jerrell Blakeley of the Healthy Schools Now Coalition/Work Environment Council approach the podium. Mr. Blakeley said that SDA had reached out to him the previous week to let him know that letters had gone out to the SDA districts to advise them of the determinations that had been made regarding their emergent project submissions. Mr. Blakely said that he had submitted an Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request to SDA seeking information regarding the status of the SDA's emergent projects program. Mr. Blakeley explained that he is particularly interested in obtaining answers as to what/how many projects were approved to advance; and what percentage the number of approved projects is of the number of total submissions. He said that he also would like the documentation that had been provided by SDA to the districts. Mr. McKenna said that a response to Mr. Blakeley's OPRA request will be issued today. Mr. Blakeley thanked the Authority for meeting their commitment to advise him when the information became available. Mr. Yosha advised Mr. Blakeley that 15 projects are advancing. Mr. McKenna explained that while there were many more potential

projects submitted by the districts, DOE deemed some paperwork submissions incomplete and concluded that potential project submissions did not meet the criteria applicable to an "emergent project".

Adjournment

There being no further business to come before the Board, Mr. Walsh asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Upon motion by the Chairman and with unanimous consent, the meeting was adjourned.

INTRODUCTION

We are writing to recommend approval by the Members of the Authority of the award of a contract in the amount of \$6,682,000 to USA Environmental Management, Inc. (USA)¹ for the demolition of all existing structures on the Camden High School site in the Camden School District (District), in preparation for the delivery by the NJSDA of a New Camden High School for the District at that site.

Pursuant to the NJSDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended March 7, 2012, Board approval is required for the award of construction contracts greater than \$500,000.

BACKGROUND

At the March 7, 2012 NJSDA Board meeting, the Members approved the Authority's 2012 Capital Plan. That Plan identified a project to address facilities conditions deficiencies at Camden High School.

In order to most effectively and efficiently address facility conditions needs for the Camden High School project, the NJSDA engaged Design Ideas Group Architecture + Planning, LLC (DIG) to perform Predesign Phase services. Pursuant to Board approval provided on August 5, 2015, DIG was authorized to analyze and develop conceptual renovation options for addressing identified facility

conditions needs and, to the extent feasible, for addressing educational program needs based upon a renovation space program developed by NJDOE in conjunction with the District's Long Range Facilities Plan (LRFP). That space program, which provides for consolidation of other existing high school programs at the Camden High School campus, calls for educating 1,200 students in four small learning communities of 300 students each.

To support effective analysis of the options, DIG was required to undertake a detailed facility conditions assessment. Significantly, preliminary studies confirmed that a complete renovation of the existing Camden High School facility would not be cost effective.

Comparative analysis also revealed that:

- A new school facility will fully address educational program requirements whereas a renovation project would not;
- A new school facility will better address facilities conditions needs over the extended life cycle of the facility;
- The cost of a project to renovate the entire existing facility is greater than the cost of delivering a new facility;
- Construction of a new school facility through Design-Build project delivery will result in earlier delivery of the facility to the District

Therefore, on October 5, 2016, NJSDA Executive Leadership recommended advancement of a new replacement facility

On October 5, 2016, the Members of the Board approved the Preliminary Project Charter, thereby approving demolition of the existing Camden High School facility utilizing an Early Site Package, construction of a new 242,000 square foot school facility utilizing Kit of Parts design and a Design Build delivery method, and related site development work.

The Demolition Contract scope consists of the demolition of the three existing structures on the existing Camden High School site, totaling 287,500 SF.

A Design-Builder will subsequently be procured to undertake the construction of a new school facility on the site, of approximately 242,000 SF.

PROCUREMENT PROCESS

This package was advertised beginning on June 9, 2017 on the NJSDA website, NJ State website, and in selected newspapers for interested firms to participate in the bidding process.

A mandatory pre-bid conference and site visit was held on June 23, 2017.

Project Rating Proposals were received from bidders by June 30, 2017. Bidders were evaluated based on the largest of four projects completed in the past seven years, safety records as well as reference checks. Based on evaluation of the information submitted, seventeen (17) bidders received a Project Rating Limit.

Requests for Information (RFIs) were received by July 5, 2017. An addendum containing responses to the RFIs was issued to the bidders on July 13, 2017.

Price Proposals were received on July 25, 2017. The Price Proposals were publicly opened and the lump sum base bids were read aloud as required by law.

Following the public bid opening, the NJSDA performed a review of the Price Proposals to determine the responsiveness of each bidder to the solicitation. The review determined that eight (8) bidders were responsive. The results of the review are listed below:

The responsive low bidder was USA Environmental Management, Inc.

The bid submitted by USA was below the CCE. In order to understand the differential between the CCE and the bid price and to ensure the contractor's price proposal was inclusive of all scope elements, a conference was conducted on July 26, 2017 with Procurement, Program Operations, Contract Management Division, NJSDA's Site Consultant (Brinkerhoff Environmental Services, Inc.) and USA to review the bid. The discussion verified that USA had included all work per the scope of the project and identified variances between the NJSDA's CCE and USA's price proposal in several areas. The majority of the overall variance is attributable to the contractor's ability to perform the majority of the construction activities including asbestos abatement and the majority of the demolition scope with its own forces and equipment, as well as its ability to dispose of impacted materials at a price below NJSDA estimates. At the time of review, USA confirmed that its price proposal is inclusive of all scope elements contained in the Contract Documents.

The Program Operations Director and the Contract Management Division recommend award of the project to USA Environmental Management, Inc.

INTRODUCTION

At the March 7, 2012 NJSDA Board Meeting, the Members of the Authority approved the Authority's 2012 Capital Plan. That Plan identified the Keansburg Caruso Elementary School (Caruso E.S.) project for validation and advancement into Pre-Development. At the October 3, 2012 NJSDA Board Meeting, the Members approved a unified approach to address District-wide overcrowding in the Keansburg School District by approving advancement of projects at two facilities, the first being the recently completed 122,140 SF New Joseph C. Caruso E.S. and the other being the renovation and addition to the Port Monmouth Road School.

We are writing to recommend approval by the Members of the attached Preliminary Charter, created by Program Operations staff, which details project advancement recommendations including estimated project costs for project completion. Pursuant to the NJSDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended March 7, 2012, Preliminary Project Charters require approval by the Members of the Authority.

BACKGROUND

As stated above, the projects at the Caruso E.S. and the Port Monmouth Road School were approved to collectively address District-wide overcrowding, together educating students in grades Pre-K to four.

The renovation and addition to the Port Monmouth Road School will result in an approximately 46,500 square foot facility designed to educate 315 Pre-Kindergarten students. This school is comprised of three distinct areas identified as Wings A, B and C. Wings B and C are permanent building structures constructed in 1992 and 1968 respectively while Wing A is modular construction built in 1973.

Until the project is completed, District-owned modular units will continue serving as a temporary educational facility for the Port Monmouth Road School students¹.

The Authority's Design Consultant Services agreement with LAN includes performance of both 1) Predesign Phase Services and 2) Design and Construction Phase Services.

Predesign and Design Phase Services

On March 9, 2016 NJSDA issued to LAN a Notice-to-Proceed (NTP) specifically to develop and evaluate alternative design solutions to most effectively and efficiently address the District's educational program needs as well as identified facility condition deficiencies.

On December 7, 2016 the Members provided approval for LAN to proceed with Design and Construction Phase Services and approved a Revised Planning Charter detailing project advancement recommendations as well as negotiated costs for the remaining Design and Construction Phase Services. On December 23, 2016, the NJSDA issued a NTP to LAN for advancement of Schematic Design Phase Services including the development of:

- Educational Specifications;
- Schematic Design Documents;
- Updated Construction Cost Estimate (CCE);

LAN has completed all elements of the Schematic Design Phase and the NJSDA issued to LAN a NTP for Design Development Phase Services on June 14, 2017.

RECOMMENDED PROJECT SCOPE

The project scope is essentially the same as that included in the Revised Planning Charter approved by the Members on December 7, 2016, with minor refinements as indicated below:

- An approximately 27,580 square foot (SF) single story addition containing classrooms, food service, nurse's area, support facilities and connection to the renovated facility (decreased by approximately 600 SF from what had been included in the Revised Planning Charter);
- Renovation of approximately 18,930 SF of existing school facility includes classrooms, gross motor skills area and support facilities;
- Selective facility conditions improvements including a new HVAC system, fire protection system, building envelope repairs, and other systems upgrades;
- Site improvements including required outdoor Physical Education/play areas and flood prevention improvements; and

¹ Some of those modular units are located on NJSDA-owned property that will be converted to parking area for the Caruso E.S. project at the conclusion of the Port Monmouth Road School project. For these project scope phasing reasons, the Planning Charter for the Port Monmouth Road School project was revised in March 2014 to incorporate scope and costs associated with this work rather than retain those elements in the Caruso E.S. • NJSDA-owned property that will be converted to parking area for the Caruso E.S. project at the conclusion of the Port Monmouth Road School project.

PROJECT BUDGET

As detailed in the attached Preliminary Charter, the estimated cost of \$25.8 million for the project is inclusive of all prior expenditures including Predesign and Schematic Design Phase Services performed, as well as estimated future costs necessary for advancement of the current project scope including Design and Construction Phase Services by LAN and NJSDA staff costs. The budget is based upon the revised construction cost estimate provided by LAN and the application of planning estimates to the current anticipated project scope. While the Total Project Budget remains the same as that included in the Revised Planning Charter, there is an increase of \$125,795 based upon the completion of detailed schematic design work. The increased costs will be addressed utilizing existing project contingency funds.

RECOMMENDATION

The Members are requested to approve the Preliminary Charter for the Keansburg School District Port Monmouth Road School project.

The Operating Authority will govern the award of all professional services and construction contracts and notification to the Board of the use of contingency monies.

INTRODUCTION

I am writing to recommend approval by the Members of the Authority of Change Order (CO) No. 1 in the amount of \$988,000 for additional work and associated costs required to satisfy acoustical performance requirements in the project. Pursuant to the NJSDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended March 7, 2012, a change order which singularly exceeds \$500,000 or singularly or in the aggregate is greater than 10% of the contract value requires approval by the Members of the Authority. This change order exceeds \$500,000.

BACKGROUND

The Elizabeth New ES will be a 140,000 square foot facility educating 880 students in grades 2 through 8 in the Elizabeth School District. The new school is being constructed to share a site with the existing William Halloran PS No. 22 School.

At the March 7, 2012 NJSDA Board Meeting, the Elizabeth New ES was approved to advance under the Authority's Capital Program.

On November 5, 2014, the Members of the Authority approved the award of a contract for Design Build services for the project to Torcon, Inc. (Torcon), Contract No. EL-0042-B01, in the amount of \$44,456,800 and approved the Final Project Charter representing all expended and projected funds necessary for completion of the project.

On July 1, 2015, the Members of the Authority approved the award of a contract for Construction Management services for the project to Epic Management, Inc. in the amount of \$1,160,134.

REASON FOR CHANGE

Overview

The Change concerns Acoustical Performance Requirements, including requirements to achieve permissible noise levels in interior spaces through minimizing impacts of outside and inside noises upon the interior spaces.

The contract between the NJSDA and Torcon requires Design Builder conformance with identified acoustical standards, a set of standards that was applied to this project and one which has become routine to all NJSDA-managed projects initiated thereafter. For all but this and a prior project, the NJSDA has required the performance of a noise study by the Design Builder and has included an allowance in order to provide funding to address the results of the noise study, recognizing that each project's conformance with the standard would necessarily be project-specific, tailored to the results of the analysis. The NJSDA did not include the noise study requirement nor did it include a related allowance in the contract with Torcon. The Authority's approach to accurately achieve a project's requirements in this scope area has become clearer and more precise in the period following the procurement that resulted in the contract for the Elizabeth New ES.

Prior to award of the contract for this project to Torcon, a bid review conference was conducted in accordance with standard NJSDA protocol, in order to determine whether the contractor's price proposal was inclusive of all scope elements. Neither NJSDA review of the bid nor the bid review conference identified a gap with regard to the acoustical requirements, and therefore a detailed discussion about this scope item was not held during that conference.

During the course of its performance of the project scope, Torcon informed the NJSDA that, based upon its interpretation of contract requirements, its bid had not included the costs associated with work necessary to achieve the NJSDA-required acoustical standards. Nonetheless, Torcon has performed its work consistent with NJSDA requirements and Torcon is now seeking compensation for associated additional scope of work related to acoustical performance requirements.

Change Order Details

In March 2016, Torcon submitted change order requests totaling \$1,302,100 for additional work and associated costs required to satisfy acoustical performance requirements on the Elizabeth New ES project. Torcon's requests revealed that its bid had been based upon an interpretation of contract specifications different from the NJSDA's actual requirements, specifically concerning the maximum permissible noise level for interior spaces of the school.

Torcon identified that it had bid the project based upon achieving a certain level of acoustical performance, and that achieving the level it later understood was required by the NJSDA entailed adjustments to its planned delivery of the following system's design and construction modifications and related cost impacts: steel superstructure, concrete superstructure and modified concrete roofing

systems, Design and Management Services, Overhead, Profit, Bonding and Insurance. The NJSDA Project Team reviewed the merits of Torcon's request, a review that occurred in March 2016. At the time, Torcon's request was incomplete and a review could not be completed and therefore the submission was rejected. Torcon resubmitted the package to NJSDA in April 2017. The re-review initiated in April 2017 and continued through July 13, 2017 after submission of additional supporting documentation from Torcon.

All supporting documentation provided by Torcon was reviewed by the NJSDA Project Team and Contract Management Division (CMD), and negotiations have resulted in a final recommended Change Order amount of \$988,000, representing a fair and reasonable value for required project scope that had not been anticipated nor included by Torcon in its price proposal at the time of bid.

Those scope elements and the negotiated values are:

- a. **Steel Superstructure**: additional construction costs associated with approximately 278 Tons of additional Steel in the amount of \$772,419;
- b. Concrete Superstructure and Modified Concrete Roofing: additional construction costs associated with approximately 253 Cubic Yards of additional regular and lightweight concrete in the amount of \$134,539;
- c. Design Builder's Costs for Design and Management Services, Overhead, Profit, Bonding and Insurance: additional fees in the amount of \$81,042.

The NJSDA considered other items requested by Torcon, but ultimately concluded that Torcon's request lacked sufficient support for those additional items, which included costs associated with windows, and engineering evaluation and calculations.

The negotiated resolution includes Torcon's agreement that it will not pursue additional compensation for any other costs associated with acoustical performance requirements, nor for any aspect reviewed and rejected by the NJSDA.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This change order is recommended in order to compensate Torcon for additional scope of work required to satisfy the project's acoustical performance requirements. Based upon its interpretation of the contract requirements, Torcon has asserted that it failed to include in its price proposal the scope of work required to meet the project's acoustical performance requirements. Although the NJSDA bid documents were complete, we recognize that conformance with identified acoustical standards was first applied in the solicitation for this and one prior project, and that later solicitations included an allowance to provide funding to address the results of a noise study that we have since required the design builder to perform. Without the results of such a noise study, it is difficult for both the NJSDA and a bidder to identify with precision a satisfactory scope to meet the standards and a cost representative of that scope of work.

We have reviewed the work performed by Torcon in satisfaction of the requirements, and we have also reviewed information provided by Torcon to verify that its bid excluded costs associated with meeting these requirements. For these specific reasons, we recommend approval of this change order for the amount stated above.

All documents supporting this change order have been reviewed by the associated NJSDA Project Team members, Program Director, Deputy Program Director and the NJSDA Contract Management Division (CMD) for adherence to current NJSDA policy and procedures. All reviewing NJSDA staff members, including CMD, have determined that the change order is justified and that the amount is reasonable and appropriate.

INTRODUCTION

At the March 7, 2012 SDA Board Meeting, the Members approved the Authority's 2012 Capital Plan. That Plan identified a project to address facilities conditions deficiencies at Camden High School.

At the October 5, 2016 SDA Board Meeting, the Members approved a Preliminary Project Charter which provided project advancement details including estimated total costs for project completion. At that time the need and expense for temporary facilities to support advancement of the project had yet to be determined.

We are writing to advise the Members of the findings of investigations to identify appropriate temporary facilities necessary to support the advancement of the Project and to present to the Members with the attached Revised Preliminary Project Charter which provides for such temporary facilities costs including reimbursement to the District for temporary facilities lease expenses. Pursuant to the Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended March 7, 2012, approval by the Members of the Authority is required to enter into Leases with a value exceeding \$1,000,000 and/or for a term exceeding three (3) years. As discussed below, while this is not a lease that will be entered into by the SDA, it is a recommendation to enter into an agreement in excess of three years with the Camden City School District which will provide for the SDA's funding of the lease obligation of the District.

BACKGROUND

At the October 5, 2016 Board meeting the Members approved a Preliminary Project Charter for the construction of a New Camden High School (CHS) on the site of the existing school. The project scope calls for demolition of the existing facility and construction of a new modern high school facility in its place.

The recommendation presented to the Members identified the need for temporary facilities to house the existing student population during demolition of the existing school and construction of the new school. At the time the project charter was presented to the Board for approval the estimated cost of the temporary facilities was still to be determined.

The SDA and the District have worked to identify potential options to address the temporary space needs for the CHS programs, which include approximately 550 students in general and alternative high school programs and approximately 50 students in Career Technical Education (CTE) programs. These options included a review of existing District facilities, City-owned properties, and privately owned facilities.

That review concluded that the use of the District-owned Hatch Middle School facility provides for the most efficient, timely and cost effective solution to house the CHS general and alternative high school programs. However, in order to utilize this facility it is necessary to relocate the existing grade 9-12

Camden Big Picture Learning Academy, a program which will also be housed in the New Camden High School facility, to the privately owned Camden Boys and Girls Club facility, which was recently vacated by a charter school. The District has negotiated a sub-lease agreement with the charter school to temporarily use that facility at an expense of \$200,000 per year for a four-year term totaling \$800,000.

In addition to the lease expense, certain improvements have been identified as necessary at the Boys and Girls Club facility, including relocation of lockers from the existing CHS facility, with an estimated expense of approximately \$50,000.

Additionally, the existing automotive and construction technology CTE programs will be relocated to the Woodrow Wilson High School (WWHS) which was the only facility identified as being appropriate to house these programs. While the District will relocate the majority of equipment necessary to support these programs, SDA will relocate certain larger CTE equipment including the automotive lifts. The costs associated with relocation of these programs have been estimated at approximately \$100,000.

The Department of Education (DOE) has inspected the identified Temporary Facilities for relocation of grade 9-12 students from CHS. DOE Approval of the Temporary Facilities and the Boys and Girls Club Lease Agreement will be received by the New Jersey Schools Development Authority prior to the execution of an agreement with the District.

Demolition of the existing CHS facility is scheduled to commence in the Fall of 2017 with substantial completion of the new high school construction scheduled for May 2021.

TEMPORARY FACILITIES BUDGET

The Preliminary Project Charter has been revised to include a total of \$950,000 for Temporary Facilities expenses as follows:

WHEREAS, in March 2012, the Members approved the Authority's 2012 Capital Plan identifying a project to address facilities conditions deficiencies at Camden High School in the Camden City School District (District); and

WHEREAS, in October 2016, the Members approved a Preliminary Project Charter for the construction of a New Camden High School (CHS) on the site of the existing school with a project scope including demolition of the existing facility and construction of a new modern high school facility in its place (Project); and

WHEREAS, the preliminary charter provided Project advancement details including estimated total costs for project completion, but left to be determined the expense associated with temporary facilities to house the existing student population during demolition and construction activities; and

WHEREAS, SDA and the District have reviewed existing District facilities, City-owned properties and privately owned facilities in an effort to identify potential options to address the temporary space needs for the various CHS programs; and

WHEREAS, this review concluded that the use of the District-owned Hatch Middle School facility, Woodrow Wilson High School facility and the Camden Boys and Girls Club (BGC) facility provide the most efficient, timely and cost effective solution for housing the CHS high school programs; and

WHEREAS, utilization of these facilities will require certain expenditures for relocation, lease and fit out/improvements as fully described in the memorandum presented to the Board on this date and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the Project's background and temporary facilities budget are set forth in detail in the memorandum presented to the Board on this date and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, SDA management recommends that the Board authorize the SDA to enter into an agreement with the Camden City School District to reimburse it for lease expenses associated with the temporary use of the BGC as fully described in the memorandum presented to the Board on this date and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, SDA management recommends that the Members of the Authority approve the revised Preliminary Project Charter as presented for the Camden City School District's New Camden High School project.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Members of the Authority hereby authorize and approve the revised Preliminary Project Charter for the Camden City School District's New Camden High School project.

Vendor Services staff continues to participate at mandatory pre-bid and pre-construction meetings to instruct and inform bidders regarding SDA's SBE goals, policies and procedures, including:

- Small Business Enterprise subcontracting goal of 25% of all contracts
- County workforce goals for minorities and females
- Detailed process procedures to monitor and track the progress made toward these goals throughout the life cycle of each project

At these meetings, vendors are strongly encouraged to identify and hire minority-owned and womenowned firms, as well as locally-based enterprises, for diverse business participation on all school building projects. Additional outreach strategies are discussed and utilized.

SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (SBE) COMPLIANCE MONITORING

The SDA regularly exceeds the State-mandated 25% SBE goal. The total SDA contract dollars awarded through May 31, 2017 was \$75,253,221. The figures below demonstrate compliance with this requirement.

SBE Breakdown

The total contract dollars awarded to all SBE contractors was \$22,658,121 (including minorities and women). This represents 30.11% of all SDA contracts.

SUBJECT: Monthly Financial Report - June 2017

The Office of the Chief Financial Officer is providing the attached monthly financial report to the Members of the Authority for their information. Included on pages 1 and 2 of this report is a "Financial Summary" of the Authority's activities for the year. On pages, 3 and 4 of the report is a summary of the Authority's operating expenditures. Page 5 contains a breakdown of the Authority's headcount information by department/division. The basic financial statements follow on pages 6 and 7.

Year-to-Date Authority Operating Expenses (Actual vs. Budget)

For June 2017 year to date, Authority operating expenses, **\$10.8 million**, are **down \$1.4 million as** compared to the operating budget for the *corresponding period*. The deviation of actual expenses versus budget is due to:

- Lower salary & benefit costs **\$1.1M.** The Authority is currently 23 FTEs under budget. This variance is offset by the year to date allocation of payroll expense to project cost that is lower than projected, **(\$391K)**;
- Lower MIS spending for system hardware and MIS projects \$272K.

Year-to-Date <u>Authority Operating Expenses</u> (Actual vs. Prior Year Actual)

For June 2017 year to date, Authority operating expenses, **\$10.8 million**, are **\$901K** higher as compared to the corresponding prior year. This variance is primarily due to the impact of a non-cash accrual for pension expense recorded for GASB 68.

Year-to-Date School Facilities Project Expenditures (Actual vs. Forecast)

For June 2017 year to date, project expenditures, \$189.7 million, are higher by \$19.5 million as compared to the capital-spending forecast for the corresponding period. The variance is due to increased activity in construction work \$4.9M, school furniture, fixtures and equipment \$4.0M, and grants \$15.9M. This variance is offset by decreased spending in property acquisitions \$2M and other project related costs \$3.3M.

Year-to-Date School Facilities Project Expenditures (Actual vs. Prior Year Actual)

For June 2017 year to date, project expenditures, **\$189.7 million**, have **decreased** by **\$4.5 million** as compared to the *corresponding prior year*. The variance is primarily due to decreased spending in construction related activity **\$19.7** and other project related costs **\$4.3M.** Offsetting these cost reductions are spending increases in grants **\$19.5M**.

Other

Since program inception, 78.6% of the funds authorized for the SDA Districts have been disbursed. Additionally, since program inception 96% of all SDA disbursements relate to school facilities projects and 4% relate to operating expense.

The estimated value of active school facilities projects is approximately \$2.2B.
