APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

AUGUST 1, 2018 OPEN SESSION

NEW JERSEY SCHOOLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 1, 2018

A meeting of the Board of Directors of the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA or the Authority) was held on Wednesday, August 1, 2018 at 9:00 A.M. at the offices of the Authority at 32 East Front Street, Trenton, New Jersey.

being a quorum of the Board. Mr. Elbert, Ms. Lemelle and Mr. Piaia participated in the meeting by teleconference.

At the Chairman's request, Charles McKenna, chief executive officer; Albert Alvarez, chief of staff; Andrew Yosha, executive vice president; Jane F. Kelly, vice president and assistant secretary; Donald Guarriello, vice president and chief financial officer; Manuel Da Silva, vice president; and Albert Barnes, chief counsel of the SDA, participated in the meeting. Adam Sternbach of the Governor's Authorities Unit also participated in the meeting.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Nixon, who requested that Ms. Kelly read the requisite notice of the meeting. Ms. Kelly announced that the meeting notice had been sent to the

Trenton Times and Star-Ledger at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, and had been duly posted on the Secretary of State's bulletin board at 33 West State Street in Trenton, New Jersey. Ms. Kelly then conducted a roll call and indicated that a quorum of the Members was present.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

The Chairman then presented for consideration and approval the Minutes of the June 6, 2018 Open and Executive Session meetings. Staff had provided a copy of both sets of minutes and a resolution to the Members for review in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Maloney and seconded by Mr. Luckie, the Members unanimously approved the Open and Executive Session meeting minutes of the June 6, 2018 SDA Board meeting.

Authority Matters

CEO Report

Mr. Nixon asked Mr. McKenna for the Report of the Chief Executive Officer. Mr. McKenna opened his report with an update on the Trenton Central HS (TCHS) project. He said that interior rough-in HVAC, fire suppression, electric, plumbing and framing are all ongoing, along with site work and parking lot curb installation.

Mr. McKenna reported that for the Camden HS project, demolition of the 1916 building is complete and site leveling work is ongoing. He said that staff received proposals for design-build services last month and the recommendation for a contract award is on today's agenda. For the East Orange George Washington Carver ES project, he advised that the contractor completed footings and foundations last month and under slab utility work is ongoing. He added that steel is in fabrication and erection is projected for later this month.

Mr. McKenna reported that for the Elizabeth New ES project, Torcon, the design-builder, continues to address closeout activities. He said that the Garfield James Madison ES No. 10 will

open in September. He added that furniture installation and IT integration is ongoing. He noted that district move-in began the previous month. He reported that staff had applied for a temporary certificate of occupancy (TCO) the previous week.

Mr. McKenna informed the Members that for the Harrison New ES project, design phase services are complete and the design-builder has submitted the final design package for the remainder of the structure to the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) for review. He said that Brockwell & Carrington continues with the installation of footings, foundations and grade beams.

Mr. McKenna reported that for the Irvington Madison Avenue ES project, roofing installation work is ongoing, as is masonry work and exterior brick veneer work. For the Keansburg Port Monmouth Road ES project, he said that LAN Associates continues with design-phase services. He said that for the addition and renovation project at the Millville HS, Hall Construction, the design-builder, continues with design phase services. He added that demolition, renovation and temporary cafeteria installation work is ongoing.

Mr. McKenna advised that for the New Brunswick Paul Robeson ES project, furniture installation is complete and IT integration work is ongoing. He noted that district move-in commenced last month. He added that a certificate of occupancy (CO) was issued on July 27.

Mr. McKenna said that for the Newark South Street ES project, furniture installation is complete and IT integration is ongoing. He added that staff received a TCO on July 30. He noted that district move-in commenced the previous month.

Turning to the projects in the Orange School District, Mr. McKenna informed the Members that staff anticipates advertising for construction services in September for both the Cleveland ES and Orange HS projects.

Mr. McKenna then gave an update on projects in the Passaic School District. He said that for the Leonard Place ES project, the building is weather tight. He noted that interior finish, exterior building and site work is ongoing. For the Dayton Avenue Educational Campus project, he reported that Terminal Construction, the design-builder, continues with design phase services. He added that the design-builder is preparing for soil placement and bridge work.

Mr. McKenna advised the Members that for the Paterson Union Avenue MS project (former site of Don Bosco Academy), early site package work was completed the previous month. He said that the proposals are due this month in response to SDA's advertisement for design-build services. For the Pemberton Denbo Crichton ES project, he reported that Ernest Bock & Sons, Inc. (EBS), the design-builder, continues with design phase services. He said that footings, foundations, under slab utilities and structural steel work is all ongoing.

Mr. McKenna reported that for the Perth Amboy Seaman Avenue ES project, footings, foundation, exterior building metal framing installation, site utility and curb installation work is ongoing there, as is concrete masonry unit interior partition, ductwork and hollow-metal frame installation work. He added that electrical rough-in and stair installation also is ongoing.

Mr. McKenna informed the Members that for the Plainfield Woodland ES project, early site package bids were received and a recommendation for contract award is on today's agenda. He advised that the SDA-engaged contractor has initiated delivery of temporary classroom units that will serve as temporary space during advancement of the new Woodland ES project. For the Vineland New MS project, he said that furniture installation and IT integration work is complete and that district move-in started last month. He added that staff applied for the building TCO on July 29.

Mr. McKenna then briefly discussed the emergent projects at the Paterson International HS and the Newark Science Park HS and the efforts expended by staff in connection therewith.

Turning next to ongoing procurement activity, Mr. McKenna said that, later in the meeting, management will be presenting a design-build services award for the Camden HS project, a demolition and site preparation services award for the Plainfield Woodland ES project, and a construction services award for the Plainfield HS project. He said that other activity currently underway includes procurements for design-build services for the Paterson Union Avenue MS project; and the furniture, fixtures and equipment term contract.

Reporting on events, outreach and other SDA activities, Mr. McKenna reported that staff recently issued the SDA's Biannual Report. He said that he hopes that the Members all have had a chance to review the Report.

Mr. McKenna informed the Members that staff is working on scheduling ribbon cutting events for the new Lincoln Avenue MS in Vineland, the South Street ES in Newark, the James Madison ES in Garfield and the Robeson School in New Brunswick.

Mr. McKenna said that today marks the last time that he will be addressing the SDA Board. He then recapped many of the Authority's accomplishments during his tenure at the SDA. He said that this is a great organization with great people. He said that he knows that his successor will to a great job and he has total confidence that she will lead this organization as well as he has or better. He then thanked the Members for their dedication and great work.

Chairman's Report

Election of SDA Chief Executive Officer

Mr. Nixon then provided the Chairman's Report. Referencing his memorandum that was provided to the Members in advance of the meeting, he said that before the Board is the

nomination of Lizette Delgado-Polanco to serve as the Authority's next CEO. He introduced Ms. Delgado-Polanco to the Board and staff and provided a brief description of her experience and credentials.

Following discussion, upon a motion by Mr. Maloney and seconded by Mr. Luckie, the Board approved the nomination of Lizette Delgado-Polanco to serve as the Authority's Chief Executive Officer with the Members' unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 4b*.

School Review Committee

Design-Build Award and Approval of Final Project Charter - Camden School District - Camden High School; Demolition and Site Preparation Award - Plainfield School District - New Woodland Elementary School; Release of Funds from Program Reserve, Award of Contract, and Approval of the Final Project Charter - Plainfield School District - Plainfield High School - Emergent Project - Stairway Structural Repairs

Mr. Nixon asked Mr. Luckie to provide the report of the School Review Committee. Mr. Luckie reported that the School Review Committee met on July 16, 2018. He said that the first item for Board consideration is a design-build award and final project charter for the Camden HS project. He advised the Board that the new Camden HS project involves construction of an approximately 277,026 square foot building to educate approximately 1,200 students in grades 9 through 12 on the site of the prior Camden HS facility. He added that the new facility will consist of four (4) small learning communities, a main gymnasium, an auxiliary gymnasium, and an auditorium. He informed the Members that, in August 2015, the Board approved a recommendation of award to Design Ideas Group Architecture (DIG) for pre-design services to evaluate the existing Camden HS. Mr. Luckie said that, after completion of DIG's assessment, SDA Executive Leadership recommended replacement of the Camden HS with a new, modern, educationally appropriate facility. He advised the Members that, in October 2016, the Board approved a preliminary project charter, thereby authorizing 1) demolition of the existing Camden

HS facility utilizing an early site package; 2) construction of a new facility utilizing kit of parts design and a design-build delivery method; and 3) related site development work. He explained that abatement and demolition of the prior facility started in September 2017 and is scheduled for completion in September 2018. Mr. Luckie advised that SDA advertised a package for design-build services on March 23, 2018 with "price" weighted as 60% of the overall weight and "all non-price factors" having a combined weight of 40%. He said that, following the competitive procurement process, management is recommending award of a contract for design-build services in the amount of \$99,585,000 to EBS for the Project. He added that EBS has confirmed that its price proposal is inclusive of all scope elements contained in the contract documents. Mr. Luckie noted that management also is recommending that the Board approve the final charter for the Project which represents all expended and projected funds necessary for completion of the Project.

A resolution pertaining to this matter was provided to the Board for review in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Vargas and seconded by Mr. Nixon, the design-build award and final charter for the Camden HS project were approved with the Board's unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 5a*.

Next, Mr. Luckie said that the Committee is recommending approval of a demolition and site preparation contractor award for the Plainfield New Woodland ES project (the Project). He reminded the Members that, at the April 2018 Board Meeting, the Board approved a revised preliminary project charter for a new two-story school facility on the Plainfield Public School District-owned Woodland ES site. He said that the Project scope includes the demolition of the existing Woodland ES and the construction of a new approximately 121,000 square foot facility to educate 756 students in grades Kindergarten to five. He explained that the new school will

serve as a replacement facility for both the existing Woodland ES and the Cook ES. Mr. Luckie advised the Members that the preliminary project charter revision incorporated several adjustments in order to address flood plain concerns identified in July 2017 related to a portion of the existing site. He said that the adjustments included the resequencing of Project activities such that construction of the new school would follow demolition of the existing Woodland ES, thereby allowing the new school to be constructed outside of the flood plain. He also said that the revised charter reflected the provision of temporary space at the existing Cook ES to allow the district to vacate the Woodland ES at the end of the 2017-2018 school year. Mr. Luckie reported that demolition and site preparation activities will begin after the existing Woodland ES facility has been vacated and SDA will provide eight (8) leased temporary classroom units to provide necessary temporary space beginning with the 2018-2019 school year. He advised that, following cancelation of a previous bid process, a solicitation for demolition and site improvement services was re-advertised beginning on May 23, 2018. He added that, upon completion of the competitive procurement process, management recommends award of the contract in the amount of \$1,644,444 to Two Brothers Contracting, Inc. (Two Brothers). He said that, at the time of review, Two Brothers confirmed that its price proposal is inclusive of all scope elements contained in the contract documents.

A resolution pertaining to this matter was provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Vargas and seconded by Mr. Nixon, the demolition and site preparation contractor award for the Plainfield New Woodland HS project was approved with the Board's unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 5b*.

In continuing, Mr. Luckie said that the Committee also is advancing for Board approval a release of funds from the program reserve, contract award and final charter for the Plainfield HS

(PHS) project. He said that the PHS, built in 1916 with several additions, is an approximately 365,000 square foot facility in the Plainfield Public School District educating approximately 1,600 students in grades 9 through 12. He reported that, in July 2008, the Board approved the 2008 SDA New Funding Allocation and Capital Plan which allocated \$97 million to fund emergent projects in the 31 SDA Districts. Mr. Luckie said that in March 2011, the Board approved the 2011 Capital Program which allocated \$100 million to fund emergent projects creating a total reserve of \$197 million to address emergent projects. He informed the Members that, in July 2016, the Department of Education (DOE) and SDA launched a third statewide effort to identify and evaluate potential emergent projects throughout the SDA Districts, resulting in the identification of an emergent project at Plainfield HS involving structural repairs or replacement stairs located in the 1916 portion of the building. Mr. Luckie reported that, in December 2016, the SDA and DOE performed a joint site visit and, thereafter, DOE issued preconstruction approval in June 2017 for the advancement of the Project. He said that SDA determined to advance the project by way of a rotational assignment to Catcord Construction Company, Inc. (Catcord) through the SDA's GC task order contract. He noted that Catcord has confirmed its interest in the project which will be awarded on a time and materials basis for the initial phases. Mr. Luckie informed the Members that, upon completion of design, the SDA will review and validate the final projected cost and schedule for the scope of work and determine whether to advance the construction work on a time and material basis, or to establish a fixed cost for the scope of work defined in the construction documents. He said that, following review by the contracts management division and program operations staff, management recommends that the Board authorize procurement staff to proceed with the issuance of a task order to Catcord in the not-to-exceed amount of \$897,774. He advised that management also recommends that the Board approve the Project's final charter and the release of \$1,202,774 from the emergent program reserve which has funding available to advance the Project. Mr. Luckie noted that the Project's background and scope of work, along with details relevant to the procurement process followed and final project charter, are set forth in the Board memorandum.

A resolution pertaining to this matter was provided to the Board in advance of the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Maloney and seconded by Mr. Vargas, a release of funds from the program reserve, contract award and final charter for the Plainfield HS project were approved with the Board's unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution 5c*.

Public Comments

The Chairman asked Mr. Frank Faras to address the Board. Mr. Faras advised the Board that he resides across the street from the Trenton Central High School project site. He said that when the SDA was proposing construction of the new TCHS, Mr. McKenna had promised installation of an Olympic sized swimming pool for the school. Mr. McKenna responded that he had never promised an Olympic sized swimming pool.

Mr. Faras reiterated his contention that Mr. McKenna had promised the Olympic sized pool when speaking in front of the Trenton School Board at a meeting where he (Mr. Faras) was present. He said that what was promised is not what was delivered—an indication of the Authority's track record during the whole process. Mr. McKenna said that he and Mr. Faras would have to agree to disagree. The Chairman advised that, other than Mr. Faras, the Authority has received no complaints from either the Trenton School Board or the general public in this regard. Mr. Faras said that the pool that was promised was 50 yards in length vs. the 25 meter pool that is being installed. Mr. Sherman interjected that a 25 meter pool is the standard sized high school pool. He said that SDA typically does not provide pools and is doing so here as the old TCHS had a pool and SDA determined to provide a pool in this case for that reason. Mr.

Faras stated that the pool that is being provided is not what previously was in place—another example of SDA promises not kept.

Mr. Maloney said that over the past 4 ½ years, Mr. Faras has harassed Mr. McKenna and the Board. He said that no one else in the City of Trenton has complained except for Mr. Faras. He said that the City of Trenton is getting a new modern high school and that all Mr. Faras does is harass and that it is uncalled for. He said that Mr. Faras owes Mr. McKenna an apology. Mr. Faras indicated that he owed no one an apology. He complained that the Board has never questioned what Mr. McKenna was promising and what he was delivering. The Chairman assured Mr. Faras that when he (Mr. Faras) has raised issues, the Board has followed up on his concerns and has found them to be personal in nature and not based in the reality of what was being delivered. He said that SDA has received nothing but kudos from the residents of the City of Trenton and the School Board. He said that the new high school will be a resounding success for the City of Trenton. He said that Mr. Faras and the Authority will have to agree to disagree. Mr. Faras said others have come forward to complain to the Authority but have given up. He said that he lives down the street and that it is no problem for him to come forward to complain when the SDA "screws up". Mr. Faras said that the pool size is a perfect example. Mr. Nixon said that he has nothing but faith in the staff. Mr. Faras said that he has no problem with the staff but, rather, he has a problem with management. He expressed his relief that Mr. McKenna is leaving the Authority.

Mr. Nixon then announced that the Board would be adjourning into Executive Session.

Ms. Kelly said that the Board has resolved to adjourn into Executive Session to discuss a recommendation for determination of property value, declaration of surplus property and

authorization for the sale and conveyance of 711-729 Main Avenue in Passaic. She said that the Board's vote on this matter would take place upon its return to Open Session.

Thereafter, upon motion by the Chairman and with unanimous consent, the meeting adjourned into Executive Session.

Following discussion in Executive Session, the Board returned to Open Session.

Mr. Vargas said that, following discussion in Executive Session, the Real Estate Committee recommends that the Board approve management's recommendation for a determination of property value, declaration of surplus property and authorization for the sale and conveyance of 711-729 Main Avenue in Passaic. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Luckie and seconded by Mr. Kanef, the Board approved the Committee's recommendation in this matter with its unanimous vote in favor of *Resolution A1*.

Adjournment

There being no further business to come before the Board, upon motion by Chairman Nixon and with unanimous consent, the meeting was adjourned.

INTRODUCTION

We are writing to recommend approval by the Members of three related actions to address emergent conditions at the Hawkins Street and Wilson Annex Schools in the Newark Public School District:

- 1. The release of funds from the NJSDA Program Reserve, maintained for emergent projects;
- 2. The award of a construction contract to Ernest Bock and Sons, Inc. in the Not-To-Exceed (N.T.E.) value of \$624,274; and
- 3. The Final Charters (copies attached) representing the project budgets inclusive of the N.T.E. dollar values for the award of construction, appropriate contingency, allowances, NJSDA staff costs and other costs.

As discussed below, the recommended actions represent N.T.E values to support development and implementation of the most appropriate, efficient and timely action to address the emergent conditions.

Pursuant to the NJSDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended on March 7, 2012, Board approval is required for the release of monies from the Program Reserve for emergent projects or emergency situations exceeding \$500,000. Further, the Operating Authority requires Board approval of the award of construction contracts greater than \$500,000 as well as approval of a Final Project Charter. Both the construction award and the release of funds from the reserve exceed \$500,000.

At the July 2008 Board meeting, the Members approved the 2008 New Funding Allocation and Capital Plan which allocated \$97 million to fund emergent projects in the 31 SDA Districts. Additionally, at the March 2, 2011 Board meeting, the Members approved the 2011 Capital Program which allocated an additional \$100 Million to fund emergent projects creating a total reserve of \$197 million to address emergent projects throughout the SDA Districts. Funding for the projects is available within the established reserves for emergent projects.

NJSDA staff shall provide Construction Management oversight for the projects.

BACKGROUND

The Hawkins Street School (Hawkins), built in 1887 (with three additions), is an approximately 69,000 square foot facility in the Newark Public School District educating approximately 698 students in grades Pre-Kindergarten through 8. The Wilson School Annex, built in 1900 (Wilson), is an approximately 9,000 square foot facility in the Newark Public School District educating approximately 84 students in Pre-kindergarten and Kindergarten.

In July 2016 the NJDOE and NJSDA launched a third statewide effort to identify and evaluate potential emergent projects throughout the SDA Districts. This effort has resulted in the identification of conditions at Hawkins and Wilson for advancement as emergent projects: replacement and or repair of five chimneys in total.

On December 22, 2016, the NJSDA and NJDOE performed a joint site visit. Based upon the site visit observations and supporting documentation provided by the District, the NJDOE issued preconstruction approvals on June 22, 2017 for the advancement of emergent projects to provide for the replacement and or repair of four chimneys at the Hawkins Street School and one chimney at the Wilson School Annex.

PROCUREMENT PROCESS

The construction task order assignment recommended for this project results from utilization of the NJSDA General Construction Services Task Order (GC Task Order) Contract.

At the August 3, 2016 Board Meeting, the Members of the Authority approved the use of the GC Task Order Contract. The GC Task Order Contract has been structured so that the Authority has a pool of contractors to perform certain work. Overall, no individual task order can exceed \$3 million and no individual firm can receive more than \$5 million of work per region during the duration of the Contract. Bidders were required to select a region (North, South, or both) for job order assignments. Bidders were also required to accept the defined cost multiplier of 1.10, as determined by the Authority, for use in establishing compensation for those task order rotational assignments to be performed, at least for the initial phases, on a time and materials basis. GC Task Order Contract work may also be assigned on a lump sum fee basis after competitive bidding among Task Order Contractors.

NJSDA determined to advance the projects by way of a rotational assignment. Due to the similarity of the work required at both schools in the same district, and the limited work required at the Wilson School Annex, it was determined to assign the work for both projects to one contractor. On April 17, 2018,

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Procurement staff contacted Ernest Bock and Sons, Inc. (EBS), the next firm on the contractor rotational list, and confirmed its interest in the project. This package will be awarded on a time and material basis for the initial phases.

SCOPE OF WORK

Site visits were held with EBS on April 23, 2018 at Wilson and on May 3, 2018 at Hawkins to review and assess the condition of the chimneys in order to provide a cost estimate on the value of the corrective work. NJSDA staff instructed EBS to engage a design consultant and any sub-consultants necessary for developing a proposal, cost estimate and schedule that recognizes an approach to implementing appropriate action(s) to address the emergent condition related to repair and or replacement of the chimneys.

The scope of work for this engagement includes:

- 1. Design Services including:
 - Performance of field investigative activities necessary to develop options to address repair or replacement of the chimneys;
 - Based upon the NJSDA's selected option, preparation of all necessary plans, specifications and construction documents representing construction activities, inclusive of modifications to the existing structures;
 - Preparation of documents to secure construction permits; and
 - Preparation of record set drawings and plans at completion of each project.
- 2. The Construction Services is comprised of:
 - Implementation of the selected options to address the condition of the chimneys
- 3. Performance of hazardous material abatement activities as necessary to implement the above-described scope of work; and
- 4. Performance of any code or regulatory improvements which are necessitated by implementation of the above-described scope of work.

An allowance of \$60,000 has been established for additional investigative activities and hazardous material abatement.

On August 3, 2018, EBS provided the NJSDA with a cost estimate to complete the entirety of the work, inclusive of the assessment, design services and implementation of the scope of work proposed by NJSDA to remedy the emergent conditions. The above-mentioned assessment when completed will enable to NJSDA to select the most appropriate solution to address the identified condition. The recommended award in the N.T.E. amount of \$624,274 represents EBS's cost proposal for the most extensive solution including:

- Hawkins School Demolition and reconstruction of 4 chimneys;
- Wilson School Annex Demolition and reconstruction of 1 chimney;
- Any anticipated code improvements necessary to implement the above scope; and
- The allowance of \$60,000 for additional investigative activities and hazardous material abatement.

Release of Funds from Program Reserve, Award of Contract, and Approval of Final Project Charters Newark Public School District – Hawkins Street and Wilson Annex Schools – Emergent Projects September 5, 2018

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Upon completion of design, the NJSDA shall review and validate the final projected cost and schedule for the scope of work. This review shall result in a determination to either advance the construction work on a time and material basis, or to establish a fixed cost for the scope of work defined in the construction documents.

The Contract Management Division (CMD) and Program Operations reviewed EBS's cost proposal in the amount of \$624,274 and determined it was reasonable for the elements included in the Scope of Work. The Program Operations Managing Director, Program Planning Director and CMD recommend that Procurement proceed with the issuance of a task order to EBS.

PROJECT BUDGETS

EBS's cost estimated provided a separate cost for the work at each school facility. The project budgets established in the attached charters represent the allocation of costs between the two schools and include appropriate contingency, SDA staff costs and other costs. These budget are:

WHEREAS, the Newark Wilson School Annex (Wilson School), built in 1900, is an approximately 9,000 square foot facility in the Newark Public School District educating approximately 84 students in grades pre-kindergarten and kindergarten; and

WHEREAS, in July 2016, New Jersey Department of Education (DOE) and SDA launched a third statewide effort to identify and evaluate potential emergent projects throughout the SDA Districts; and

WHEREAS, this effort resulted in the identification of conditions at the Hawkins and Wilson Schools (collectively "the Projects") for advancement as emergent projects, specifically involving replacement and or repair of five chimneys in total; and

INTRODUCTION

We are writing to recommend approval by the Members of the Authority of the award of a contract in the amount of \$57,932,000 to Epic Management, Inc. (Epic)¹ for Design-Build services for the new Middle School at Union Avenue (Union Ave MS) in the Paterson School District.

The Design-Build Team will complete the design of the new Union Ave MS facility utilizing NJSDA-developed schematic design documents and will also provide construction and construction administration services, including securing of all required permits and approvals, for construction of a new middle school for grades 6 through 8. The form of contract for this engagement is a Design-Build contract with the general contractor as the lead and with relevant trades and design disciplines serving in sub-contractor and sub-consultant roles.

We are also recommending approval by the Members of the attached Final Project Charter representing the project budget inclusive of dollar values for the award of the Design-Build package.

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Pursuant to the NJSDA Operating Authority adopted by the Board on December 1, 2010, as amended March 7, 2012, Board approval is required for the award of construction contracts greater than \$500,000 and for the approval of the Final Project Charter.

BACKGROUND

The new Union Ave MS project will consist of the construction of an approximately 163,000 SF building to educate 996 students in grades 6 through 8 on the site of the former Don Bosco School acquired by the NJSDA in May 2004, with the Don Bosco School utilized as a school facility through the 2016-2017 school year.

On April 1, 2015, the Members of the Authority approved the Preliminary Project Charter, thereby approving demolition of the existing Don Bosco School utilizing an Early Site Package and construction of a new middle school facility on the Union Avenue site through a Design-Build project delivery method, utilizing a standard NJSDA Kit of Parts programmatic model and design, with in-house schematic design development. Additionally, the Preliminary Project Charter recognized the Members' December 2014 approval for the acquisition of the former Paterson Catholic HS facility to serve as a temporary space for the students displaced during the demolition of the Don Bosco School and construction of the new facility. Upon completion of the Union Ave MS, it is expected that the former Paterson Catholic HS will serve as a permanent District facility to assist in alleviating remaining district-wide overcrowding.

On May 3, 2017, the NJSDA Board approved the award of a Demolition contract to Tricon Enterprises, Inc. The abatement and demolition of the Don Bosco School commenced on August 4, 2017, and was completed on July 30, 2018.

A Construction Management Firm will be engaged to manage the construction of the new Union Ave MS. Advertisement for the procurement of these services will initiate during the fourth quarter of 2018.

PROCUREMENT PROCESS

This package was advertised as a design-build solicitation beginning on April 26, 2018 on the NJSDA website, NJ State website, and in selected newspapers for interested firms to participate in the bidding process. For this procurement, "Price" is weighted as more important than all "Other Factors," with price equaling 60% of the overall weight, and all non-price factors having a combined weight of 40%.

Interested bidders were required to attend a mandatory pre-bid conference held on May 11, 2018.

In accordance with regulations, the NJSDA employed a two-step process for this procurement. The first step required interested bidders to submit a Project Rating Proposal, which was used by the NJSDA to determine each bidder's Project Rating Limit, or maximum amount that a bidder may bid, for the project. Project Rating Proposals were received by May 25, 2018. Bidders were evaluated based on the largest of four projects completed in the past seven years, safety records as well as reference checks. Based on evaluation of the information submitted, four (4) bidders received a Project Rating Limit.

The second step of the process required the bidders to simultaneously submit a Technical Proposal and a sealed Price Proposal. In advance of submission of Technical and Price Proposals, bidders were permitted to submit questions seeking clarification of the procurement documents, until June 8, 2018. Addenda responses to Bidder Questions were issued to the bidders on June 20, June 29, July 6, and July 11, 2018.

Technical and Price Proposals were received on August 2, 2018 from four (4) bidders. As described in the RFP, the Technical Proposal submission consists of two separate portions for evaluation by two distinct committees as follows:

- 1. The "Experience Criteria" portion of the Technical Proposal submission was evaluated by an Evaluation Committee comprised of three (3) NJSDA staff members. The Evaluation Committee was responsible for collectively evaluating the "Experience Criteria" on a non-numeric basis and determining, on a consensus basis, whether a bidder had demonstrated sufficient experience in the following "Experience Criteria" categories:
 - Design-Builder's Experience on Similarly Sophisticated Projects
 - Design-Builder's Design Consultant's Experience on Similarly Sophisticated Projects
 - Design-Builder's Demonstrated Prior Affirmative Action Experience
- 2. The "Project Approach Criteria" portion of the Technical Proposal submission was evaluated by a Selection Committee, comprised of five (5) NJSDA staff members and one (1) alternate, and one (1) Paterson School District representative. The Selection Committee was responsible for independently evaluating and scoring each bidder in each of the following "Project Approach Criteria" categories:
 - Approach to Project
 - Identification and Qualification of Required Key Team Members
 - Approach to Schedule
 - Approach to LEED Requirements

"Evaluation Committee" Review

The Evaluation Committee determined that each of the bidders demonstrated sufficient experience in the "Experience Criteria" categories to be considered for award.

The Selection Committee members conducted interviews with each of the four (4) Design-Build teams at NJSDA offices in Trenton on August 21, 2018 affording committee members an opportunity to obtain any additional information from each bidder team as needed to complete their evaluations of the "Project Approach Criteria" portion of the Technical Proposal.

Each Selection Committee member evaluated the "Project Approach Criteria" portion of each Technical Proposal, assigning a raw score for each category on a scale of 0 to 10 as follows:

- 9 10 points outstanding response offers significant advantages.
- 7 8 points superior response exceeds requirements with no deficiencies.
- 5 6 points sufficient response meets the requirements with no significant deficiencies.
- 3 4 points minimal response meets the requirements but contains some significant deficiencies.
- 1 2 points marginal response comprehends requirements, but contains many significant deficiencies.
- 0 points unsatisfactory response requirements not addressed and lack of detail precludes adequate evaluation.

Weighting factors were then applied to each of the Selection Committee member's raw scores for each "Project Approach Criteria" category to arrive at a total weighted score as follows in Table 2 below:

For each Technical Proposal, the individual "Project Approach Criteria" category scores awarded by a particular Selection Committee member were added together to calculate a total non-price score for that Technical Proposal. The maximum total non-price score is 100. All of the total non-price scores awarded to a Technical Proposal by the Selection Committee members were added together and averaged to arrive at a final non-price score for each Technical Proposal.

Once all the Technical Proposals were scored pursuant to the "Project Approach Criteria", the Authority opened the sealed Price Proposals and reviewed them for responsiveness. The Price Proposals were publicly opened on August 23, 2018 and the bids were read aloud as required by law.

The lowest responsive Price Proposal was awarded the maximum number of points for the price component, which is 100. All other Price Proposals were awarded points based on the percentage that each proposal exceeded the lowest bid.

The results of the NJSDA's review of the Price Proposals are listed in Table 4 below:

As stipulated in the RFP, each Bid Amount is inclusive of NJSDA-established Allowances totaling \$3,301,000, as follows: \$500,000 for General Design and Construction; \$250,000 for Fire Pump; \$250,000 for Emergency Responder Radio System; \$500,000 for Building Envelope Acoustical Enhancement; \$750,000 for Subsurface Conditions; \$250,000 for Access Roads and Site Development; \$326,000 for LED Lighting; \$100,000 for Athletic Flooring; \$225,000 for Greenhouse; and \$150,000 for Detention Basin. If utilized, the allowances for LED Lighting, Athletic Flooring and the Greenhouse

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will be funded by the District as they represent upgrades beyond the NJSDA's material and system standards.

Final Combined Scores and Final Rankings

After the Price Scores were determined for all bidders, the Price Scores were adjusted by a weighting factor of 60%. The Non-Price Scores for "Other Factors" criteria were adjusted by a weighting factor of 40%. The weighted Price Score and weighted Non-Price Score for each bidder were added together for a Final Combined Score. The maximum Final Combined Score is 100. The Final Combined Scores and Final Rankings are listed in Table 5 below:

Highest Ranked Bidder's Price Proposal

The bid submitted by Epic was less than the CCE. In order to understand the differential between the CCE and the bid price and to ensure the contractor's price proposal was inclusive of all scope elements, a conference was conducted on August 28, 2018 with Epic and staff from Procurement, Program Operations, Design Studio and Contract Management to review the bid by scope categories. The comparison by scope categories identified a variance in the costs for foundations, and the discussion revealed that this difference was attributable to Epic's utilization of timber piles compared with steel and concrete pile costs included in the NJSDA estimate. The NJSDA is satisfied with this explanation, and the discussion verified that Epic had included all work per the scope of the project. At the time of review, Epic confirmed that its price proposal is inclusive of all scope elements contained in the Contract Documents.

The Program Operations Managing Director and the Director of Financial Operations recommend award of the project to Epic Management, Inc.

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FINAL PROJECT CHARTER

The attached Final Project Budget represents the project budget inclusive of actual dollar values for the award of the Design-Build contract, current estimates for all future scope elements such as FF&E and technology, and appropriate contingencies. The budget also includes costs associated with the acquisition and fit-out of the former Paterson Catholic HS being utilized as temporary space to accommodate students during the construction of the new school. Additionally, the budget is inclusive of costs incurred related to site investigation and demolition, as well as NJSDA Staff costs for both Design and Project Management. The Final Project Charter budget of \$113.9 million represents a net increase of approximately \$1.0 million from the Board-approved Preliminary Project Charter. The difference recognizes: the inclusion of District-funded scope items, the award value for the designbuilder which exceeds the Preliminary Project Charter value that had been based upon 2015 planning assumptions, and an increase to the Construction Management Services and Technology budgets to reflect more recent project experience. These increases within the overall budget are partially offset through the utilization of design contingency included within the Preliminary Project Charter to account for potential cost increases prior to the award of the design-build contract. Additionally, the budget for temporary space has been reduced to reflect the actual costs incurred in connection with the acquisition and fit-out of the former Paterson Catholic HS building.

RECOMMENDATION

The Members of the Authority are requested to approve the award of a contract to the highest ranked bidder, Epic Management, Inc., for Contract No. PA-0011-B01 in the amount of \$57,932,000 inclusive of NJSDA-established Allowances totaling \$3,301,000. Prior to execution of the contract, the contract and related documentation will be reviewed and approved by the NJSDA Division of Chief Counsel.

The Members of the Authority are also requested to approve the attached Final Project Charter representing all expended and projected funds necessary for completion of the project.

WHEREAS, the Operating Authority of the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA or the Authority) requires that the Members of the Authority approve the award of construction contracts greater than \$500,000 and final project charters; and

WHEREAS, the new Union Avenue Middle School project (Project) will consist of construction of an approximately 163,000 square foot building on the site of the former Don Bosco School to educate approximately 996 students in grades 6 through 8; and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2015, the SDA Board approved a preliminary project charter, thereby approving demolition of the existing Don Bosco School facility utilizing an early site package, construction of a new middle school facility utilizing a kit of parts design and design-build delivery method; and

WHEREAS, the Project's preliminary project charter recognized the Board's December 2014 approval for the acquisition of the former Paterson Catholic HS facility to serve as a temporary space for the students displaced during the demolition of the Don Bosco School and construction of the new facility; and

WHEREAS, upon completion of the Project, it is expected that the former Paterson Catholic HS will serve as a permanent District facility to assist in alleviating remaining district-wide overcrowding; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, prior to its execution, the contract and related documentation will be reviewed and approved by the SDA Division of Chief Counsel.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately, but no action authorized herein shall have force and effect until 10 days, Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays excepted, after a copy of the minutes of the Authority meeting at which this resolution was adopted has been delivered to the Governor for his approval, unless during such 10 day period, the Governor shall approve the same, in which case such action shall become effective upon such approval.

Vendor Services staff continues to participate at mandatory pre-bid and pre-construction meetings to instruct and inform bidders regarding SDA's SBE goals, policies and procedures, including:

- Small Business Enterprise subcontracting goal of 25% of all contracts

- Detailed process procedures to monitor and track the progress made toward these goals throughout the life cycle of each project

At these meetings, vendors are strongly encouraged to identify and hire minority-owned and womenowned firms, as well as locally-based enterprises, for diverse business participation on all school building projects. Additional outreach strategies are discussed and utilized.

SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (SBE) COMPLIANCE MONITORING

The Office of the Chief Financial Officer is providing the attached monthly financial report to the Members of the Authority for their information. Included on pages 1 and 2 of this report is a "Financial Summary" of the Authority's activities for the year. On pages 3 and 4 of the report is a summary of the Authority's operating expenditures. Page 5 contains a breakdown of the Authority's headcount information by department. The basic financial statements follow on pages 6 and 7.

Fund Reporting Operating Expenses (Year-to-Date Actual vs. Budget)

For July 2018 year to date, Authority operating expenses, **\$10.3 million**, are lower by **\$1.4M** as compared to the operating budget for the corresponding period. The positive variance is attributed to:

- Lower personnel costs including; salary, benefits, staffing, travel and training (the Authority is currently 32 FTEs under budget), **\$1.4M.** This variance is offset by the lower than projected payroll expense allocation to project expenditures, **(\$1.1M)**;
- Year to date spending reductions related to: MIS projects \$112K, Contract Services \$206K (including DAG Fees and Project Services) and Facilities & General Office Expenses, \$111K and
- A timeline and scheduling difference for the replacement of the Primavera Contract Management system, **\$700K**.

Fund Reporting Operating Expenses (Year-to-Date Actual vs. Prior Year Actual)

For July 2018 year to date, Authority operating expenses, **\$10.3 million**, are **\$243K** higher as compared to the corresponding prior year.

School Facilities Project Expenditures (Year-to-Date Actual vs. Forecast)

For July 2018 year to date, project expenditures, \$188.5 million, are lower by \$37.2 million when compared to the capital-spending forecast for the *corresponding period*. The favorable variance is attributable to a decline in construction-related work \$29.7M, as well as ancillary spending reductions for school furniture, \$4.7M, and property management activities, \$1.6M.

School Facilities Project Expenditures (Year-to-Date Actual vs. Prior Year Actual)

For July 2018 year to date, project expenditures, \$188.5 million, have decreased by \$26.7 million when compared to the *corresponding prior year*. The year-over-year comparative reflects a reduction in current year spending for construction work \$15.9M, grant agreements \$12.8M, school furniture \$4.6M and real estate activity \$1.2M. These spending reductions are offset by the \$5.3M increase in project insurance, resulting in part, from the 2017 OCIP II premium audit credit for general liability and workman's compensation.

Other

Since program inception, 81.6% of the funds authorized for the SDA Districts have been disbursed. Additionally, since program inception 96% of all SDA disbursements relate to school facilities projects and 4% relate to operating expense.

The estimated value of active school facilities projects is approximately \$2.2B.
